## Rezime



## Rezime

Petogodišnji izveštaj predstavlja pregled poludecenjskih napora i rezultata koje je CPD postigao u oblasti prava deteta od svog osnivanja do danas. Nadamo se da će, na osnovu činjenica sadržanih u njemu, moći da se procene efekti rada CPD, baš kao što je i samo sastavljanje Izveštaja nama pomoglo ne samo u tome, već i u projektovanju dalje strategije delovanja CPD.

**Izveštaj** je podeljen u nekoliko oblasti i počinje odeljkom o situaciji u Jugoslaviji u oblasti prava deteta u svetu ovdašnjih političkih, ekonomskih i socijalnih prilika. Okolnosti u kojima se našla naša zemlja u devedesetim godinama bitno su odredile položaj dece. Ratovi u bivšoj Jugoslaviji stvorili su ogromnu ekonomsku i društvenu krizu. Osiromašenje stanovništva i politička diktatura su stvorili okruženje u kome je u svim sferama života preovladavalo nasilje, netolerancija, ksenofobija i marginalizacija najugroženijih delova stanovništva, a pre svega dece. Pozitivne političke promene koje su nastupile u jesen 2000. godine izvele su Jugoslaviju iz međunarodne izolacije i omogućile početak promena u ekonomskoj sferi. Ukoliko bi se ovakav razvoj nastavio, uz rešavanje postojećih političkih problema na jugu Srbije, Kosovu i u odnosima Srbije i Crne Gore, mogli bismo da očekujemo postepeno "ozdravljenje" društva i povoljnije uslove za ostvarivanje ljudskih prava uopšte, a time i prava deteta.

**Nakon** uvodnog dela, iznosimo naš pogled na mesto i ulogu CPD kao nevladine organizacije u ovoj oblasti, probleme s kojima smo se suočili po osnivanju i tokom petogodišnjeg rada, prioritete koje smo sebi postavili i rezultate koje smo do sada ostvarili.

- CPD je nevladina organizacija čiji je cilj ostvarivanje svih prava deteta u Jugoslaviji i širem regionu. Međutim, naš cilj je i učešće u razvoju i promociji civilnog društva. Od početka rada u CPD ulažemo napore da se organizacije civilnog društva izbore za svoje mesto u zaštiti i unapređenju ljudskih prava, kao i da sam nevladin sektor postane bitan i vidljiv element civilnog društva.

- Sistem upravljanja i odlučivanja u CPD poštuje pravila demokratskog organizovanja i delovanja. Statut, sastav i nadležnosti organa odražavaju takvu opredeljenost. Sve aktivnosti odvijaju se uz poštovanje principa koje smo postavili kao neku vrstu etičkog kodeksa u radu.

**Aktivnosti** koje sprovodi CPD su raznovrsne i odvijaju se kroz programske sektore informisanja, istraživanja i obrazovanja i sektora za razvoj politike u oblasti prava deteta. Podršku ovim programima pruža administrativni sektor. Ako bismo programske aktivnosti prikazali prema vrsti delatnosti, u poslednjih pet godina smo:

- pratili stanje u oblasti prava deteta u SRJ;
- objavili preliminarni izveštaj o ukupnom stanju prava deteta u SRJ, kao i brojne izveštaje o stanju pojedinih prava deteta;
- sproveli brojna i objavili rezultate pet istraživanja;
- učestvovali u reformi obrazovanja i sistema socijalne zaštite;
- uticali na zakonske promene i usklađivanje domaćeg sa međunarodnim pravom,
- lobirali za izmenu četiri domaća zakona i ratifikaciju pet međunarodnih ugovora;
- učestvovali u organizaciji nekoliko kampanja;
- učestvovali u formiranju dve međunarodne mreže i saradivali sa pet međunarodnih mreža;
- pomogli osnivanje četiri nevladine organizacije za prava deteta i učestvovali kao uvodničari na 13 seminara drugih nevladinih organizacija;
- aktivno učestvovali na 98 skupova u zemlji i svetu;
- omogućili formiranje i rad grupe "Deca-deci", koja je održala 40 tribina i seminara u 13 osnovnih i 10 srednjih škola;
- organizovali sedam višednevnih obuka trenera u raznim oblastima prava deteta;
- organizovali 40 seminara za profesionalce;
- obučili sedam stažera;
- organizovali i održali 55 seminara i tribina za decu;
- pružili humanitarnu pomoć velikom broju dece u bolnicama, ustanovama i kolektivnim centrima;
- objavili: 14 brojeva časopisa "Monitor", 4 autorske knjige, 1 godišnjak, 1 dvogodišnji izveštaj o radu CPD, 5 knjiga sa relevantnim međunarodnim propisima, 7 brošura i 6 priručnika;
- dali mnogobrojne intervjue za domaće i strane medije.

## Opšti kontekst i prava deteta u SRJ

### Razaranje društva i posledice za decu

Početak krize u bivšoj Jugoslaviji koincidirao je sa usvajanjem Konvencije o pravima deteta (Konvencija), pod okriljem Ujedinjenih nacija (1989. godine). Tokom narednih godina pogoršanje političkih, ekonomskih i društvenih prilika u Saveznoj Republici Jugoslaviji (Jugoslavija) imale su ogroman uticaj na uživanje prava deteta. Verujemo da će, nakon više od jedne decenije ratova, razaranja i izolacije uslediti period ekonomске konsolidacije, stabilnijih političkih prilika i društvenog oporavka.

I pored promena koje su već učinjene u Jugoslaviji postoje mnogi problemi. *Kombinacija ekonomske i političke krize*, velika nestabilnost i nesigurnost i u većem delu Jugoistočne Evrope, ozbiljno su ugrozili delotvornu primenu Konvencije o pravima deteta. U nekim državama u tom regionu, a naročito u Jugoslaviji, kriza je uticala da ukupna situacija u kojoj se deca nalaze bude mnogo gora nego što je bila početkom devedesetih godina. Oružani sukobi i s tim u vezi napetosti i traume, kao i masovno raseljavanje stanovništva, doneli su veliki problem našoj zemlji. S jedne strane, suočili smo se sa strukturalnim nejednakostima, promenama u porodičnoj sredini i uopšte, kao i nemogućnošću sistema socijalne zaštite da odgovori novonastalim potrebama.

### Političke promene u Jugoslaviji 2000. i prava deteta

Dramatični događaji od 5. oktobra 2000. okončali su deceniju diktature u Jugoslaviji. Više od toga, ti događaji su obeležili mogući kraj destabilizacije celog regiona, ratova i ekonomске propasti. Ali, preko noći se nije desilo ono što je većina dugo čekala i želeta a to su brze promene u svim sferama društva.

Kao i sa svakom iznenadnom političkom promenom, napredak ne može brzo da se postigne. Posle više meseci političkog dogovora, uspostavljene su vlade u Jugoslaviji i Srbiji. Nasleđe koje je ostavljeno ovoj zemlji je više nego očigledno.

Ekonomski, Jugoslavija je u teškoj situaciji. Politički, još uvek ima nekoliko "neuralgičnih" tačaka, a to su jug Srbije, Kosovo i odnos Srbije i Crne Gore. Ovi problemi se rešavaju, i od brzine tog procesa će zavisiti i ekonomski oporavak zemlje. Nedostatak političke i ekonomске izvesnosti čine skoro nemogućim za vlasti u Jugoslaviji da se bave planiranjem dugoročne politike u posebnim oblastima prava deteta. Za početak, ohrabruju aktivnosti Ministarstva za socijalna pitanja Srbije i Ministarstva prosvete i sporta Srbije. Takođe, pozitivan signal predstavlja formiranje Saveta za prava deteta pri Vladi Srbije.

Danas, više od 18 meseci od političkih promena u Jugoslaviji, nema velikog pomaka u unapređenju situacije za decu. Ipak, mnoga vrata su otvorena. Ono što je učinjeno jeste to da je *počeo proces demistifikacije*. Prvi put je javnost u Jugoslaviji u prilici da sazna istinu o situaciji u kojoj se nalaze deca koja su smeštena u ustanovama socijalnog staranja. Takođe može da se vidi u kakvom su stanju zdravstvene ustanove, škole i druga mesta u kojima deca borave tokom dana. Dramatična situacija u obrazovanju (u smislu profesionalizma zaposlenih, stavova, programa i plata) je predmet otvorenih debata a relevantna administracija radi na reformi. Bezbednost dece je tema o kojoj se otvoreno razgovara, bilo da je u pitanju škola, kuća ili ulica.

Što se tiče ostvarivanja prava deteta, odnosno podataka o situaciji u kojoj se deca nalaze, mi smo *u fazi utvrđivanja činjeničnog stanja*. Informacije su dostupne ali su rasute ili saznanje zahteva ozbiljniji projekat istraživanja. Državni organi su suočeni sa hitnim humanitarnim potrebama, a s druge strane, sa potrebom da formulišu dugoročnu strategiju.

*U svakom slučaju, bilo kakva značajnija promena u odnosu na situaciju u kojoj se deca nalaze zavisiće, između ostalog, od sposobnosti političkih odlučilaca u Jugoslaviji da strateški razmišljaju i sastavljaju planove za bližu i dalju budućnost. Takođe će zavisiti i od njihove sposobnosti da decu "primete" i da ih smeste u centar svoje pažnje.*

### Položaj nevladinog sektora

CPD je nevladina organizacija, odnosno, osnovana je po važećem Zakonu kao udruženje građana. Tokom devedesetih godina, nevladin sektor se intenzivno razvijao u Jugoslaviji. Osnovane su brojne nevladine organizacije, kao izraz potrebe građana da neposredno učestvuju u procesu razvoja i unapređenja društva. Jedan broj ovih organizacija, posebno one koje su se bavile promovisanjem vrednosti demokratskog društva i ljudskim pravima, dale su veliki doprinos stvaranju uslova

za demokratske promene u Jugoslaviji. Međutim, zbog političkih prilika, njihov rad je bio ograničenog dometa i često se odvijao uz velike teškoće.

Nevladine organizacije koje su za cilj imale unapređenje i razvoj prava deteta su, početkom devedesetih, bile malobrojne i nisu imale veći uticaj na kreiranje politike u oblasti prava deteta kao ni na ostvarivanje tih prava. Tokom narednih godina, osnovane su brojne organizacije koje su se bavile bilo celokupnom oblašću prava deteta, bilo nekim posebnim pitanjima. Međutim, sve do političkih promena 2000. godine, njihov uticaj na relevantnu politiku i praksu je bio mali. Najveći doprinos razvoju prava deteta dat je kroz obrazovne, istraživačke, humanitarne i informativne aktivnosti ovih organizacija.

Nakon promena 2000. godine, nevladine organizacije su u boljem položaju. Pre svega se očekuje usvajanje novog zakona o nevladinim organizacijama, koji će biti znatno savremeniji od postojećeg i u skladu sa međunarodnim standardima. Uticaj na formulisanje prava i prakse u oblasti prava deteta je neuporedivo veći nego što je ranije bio. Po prvi put možemo da vidimo rezultate naših aktivnosti u oblasti kreiranja politike, izmene postojećeg zakonodavstva, usklađivanja sa međunarodnim standardima. Što se tiče prakse, odnosno ostvarivanja prava deteta, uloga nevladinog sektora je mala ali značajna, u meri u kojoj praksa uopšte može brzo da se menja.

U ovom trenutku CPD ima dobre profesionalne odnose sa relevantnim državnim telima i postoji saradnja na konkretnim projektima. Ovakav odnos smatramo značajnim,isto kao što smatramo značajnim činjenicu da je naš nezavisan status od najvećeg značaja, jer nam pruža mogućnost da učestvujemo, ali i da posmatramo postupke državnih organa i da, kada je potrebno, intervenišemo u interesu dece.

Brojni problemi otežavaju naš rad. Prvi su finansijske prirode i drže nas u stalnom stanju neizvesnosti i nesigurnosti. Drugi su vezani za političke prilike u zemlji i nemogućnost da geografski definišemo naše aktivnosti. U rešavanju ovog problema nam pomaže nezavisan status i naše opredeljenje da se bavimo razvojem i zaštitom prava deteta bez diskriminacije, odnosno bez obzira na političke granice (iako nam je prevashodan prostor delovanja - Jugoslavija).

Najzad, baš kao i u drugim sektorima, problem predstavlja i nedostatak profesionalaca za rad u nevladinim organizacijama. I pored velikog broja kvalitetnih saradnika na posebnim projektima, nedostaju nam ljudi koji poznaju vrstu rada u ovoj specifičnoj sredini nevladinog sektora.

### **Ekonomski, socijalni i politički kontekst i prava deteta u Jugoslaviji**

Politička i ekonomska kriza devedesetih godina proizvela je ogromnu društvenu kriju koja na neki način još uvek traje. Posledice se ispoljavaju ne samo kao generalni slom sistema vrednosti, već i kao ksenofobija i netolerancija. Mnoga deca su rođena i vaspitavana na kulturi mržnje i nacionalizma, što je bio slučaj u većem delu Jugoistočne Evrope, pa i u Jugoslaviji. Deca su rasla na predrasudama koje su podsticali mediji koje je kontrolisala tadašnja vlast i sredina u kojoj žive i to može trajno da odredi njihove stavove u životu. Ukupna kriza je izolovala od sveta i Evrope čitavu zemlju, a posebno decu u Jugoslaviji. Pristup slobodnim medijima i drugim nezavisnim izvorima informacija bio je ograničen. Osnovana procena je da će dugo nakon završetka krize, generacije i generacije osećati sindrom "propuštenih" godina u smislu informacija i znanja. Većina dece u Jugoslaviji nije nikada putovala izvan granica svoje zemlje i nikada nije srela vršnjake iz neke druge zemlje. Sada, zahvaljujući većoj otvorenosti medija, filmske industrije i pristupa Internetu, neka deca se upoznaju sa životom izvan granica Jugoslavije. Nažalost, nove informacije koje su deci dostupne su geografski ograničene na Zapadnu Evropu i Ameriku, dok su informacije iz regiona, kao i iz drugih delova sveta, još uvek manje dostupne.

Iako je situacija u kojoj se deca u Jugoslaviji nalaze direktno uslovljena političkim, ekonomskim i društvenim prilikama, ona je ipak, u velikoj meri uslovljena i *stavovima o samoj deci i njihovim pravima*. Jedna od osnovnih karakteristika odnosa prema deci je previše zaštitnički stav, bar u svom verbalnom predstavljanju, jer u Jugoslaviji još uvek preovladava tipična *patrijarhalna porodična struktura* u kojoj proširena porodica igra važnu ulogu - kako u smislu pružanja pomoći, tako i u smislu uticaja. Idući od severa ka jugu zemlje, odlike patrijarhalnosti su sve izraženije ili dominantnije. Ovakva struktura porodice, u kojoj izrazito dominira pater familias, direktno utiče na stavove prema deci i na njihovo pravo na participaciju, kao i na pravo na privatnost i izražavanje mišljenja. I stavovi prema ženi, a samim tim i ženskom detetu su uglavnom diskriminatori, i opet, u izraženijoj formi idući od severa ka jugu zemlje.

*Slični su i stavovi koji važe van porodice*, što je vidljivo u obrazovnom sistemu, u zdravstvenim i institucijama socijalne zaštite, kao i u postupcima državnih i pravosudnih organa, a tradicionalni stavovi su uočljivi i kod većine onih koji donose političke odluke. Naravno, teško je očekivati različit odnos prema deci u sredini u kojoj ni ljudska prava još uvek nisu priznata i prihvaćena u društvu. Sva je prilika da promenjena politička situacija u Jugoslaviji, uključujući i izglede za neki napredak u ekonomskoj sferi i reformi zakonodavstva, neće biti dovoljni

ukoliko se ne razvijaju procesi za promenu stavova u odnosu na ljudska prava pa time i na prava deteta. Politički, ekonomski i društveni napredak nisu mogući bez poštovanja ljudskih prava. A možda je još više od toga potrebno za poštovanje prava deteta. Posebno kada su u pitanju politička i građanska prava deteta, koja pripadaju sferi privatnosti i ličnih sloboda.

*Porodična situacija* - tako bitna za zdrav razvoj deteta - drastično se promenila. Najveći broj porodica u Jugoslaviji se suočio sa rastućim siromaštvom i nemogućnošću održavanja domaćinstva. U isto vreme, država nije mogla da priskoči u pomoć na isti način kako je to činila u decenijama koje su prethodile krizi, ne samo zbog toga što je velikom broju porodica odjednom bila potrebna pomoć, već i zato što je država i sama osiromašila, a svoj sve manji budžet koristila prevashodno za plaćanje dugova, za vojne potrebe ili za izdržavanje sve brojnijih policijskih snaga.

Ukratko, posle svega, *opšta situacija u kojoj se deca u Jugoslaviji nalaze* je ovakva:

- zdravlje dece je pogoršano;
- u poslednjoj deceniji je došlo do generalnog razaranja obrazovnog sistema iako je veliki broj dece bio obuhvaćen osnovnim obrazovanjem, što se odrazilo, pre svega, na kvalitet obrazovanja;
- maloletnička delinkvencija je porasla u poslednjoj deceniji prošlog veka, a maloletnici su postali počinioци i težih krivičnih dela;
- korišćenje opojnih droga i psihotropnih supstanci je u porastu;
- seksualno iskorišćavanje dece takođe;
- iskorišćavanje dece u radu, praktično nepostojeće pre devedesetih, sada je u Jugoslaviji realnost;
- pogoršana je situacija u kojoj se nalaze deca pripadnici etničkih manjina a posebno deca Romi;
- povrh svega, stotine hiljada dece koja sada žive u Jugoslaviji je doživelo neki rat i sve posledice koje iz takve situacije proizilaze, i skoro isti broj dece morao je da napusti svoje domove i da se preseli na neko drugo mesto.

*De jure*, prava deteta su u potpunosti prihvaćena u Jugoslaviji: ova država je ratifikovala Konvenciju i zato je obavezna da poštuje i obezbedi *ostvarivanje svih prava* sadržanih u ovom međunarodnom dokumentu. Nažalost, praksa ni ovde ne sledi pravo - u ovom trenutku ne možemo da se pohvalimo visokim i uravnoteženim nivoom ostvarivanja prava deteta.

## STATUT JUGOSLOVENSKOG CENTRA ZA PRAVA DETETA

### Ciljevi Član 1.



- Radi ostvarivanja svojih ciljeva Centar narediće:
- (1) prikuplja i obrađuje naučnu i stručnu literaturu u oblasti prava deteta;
  - (2) organizuje, sam ili u zajednici sa drugim organizacijama, stručne skupovane, savetovanja, seminare i druge oblike stručnog obrazovanja u ovoj oblasti;
  - (3) objavljuje knjige i druge publikacije o ovim pravima;
  - (4) organizuje naučne i stručne radnike za rad na naučnim, stručnim i istraživačkim projektima iz domena prava deteta;
  - (5) saraduje sa univerzitetima, stručnim udruženjima i drugim organizacijama u inostranstvu koja se bave pravima deteta;
  - (6) vodi bazu podataka sa bibliotekom, elektronskom bankom podataka i informativnim biltenom iz ove oblasti;
  - (7) inicira i izvodi projekte primene odnosno zaštite pojedinih prava deteta;
  - (8) inicira izmene u zakonodavstvu i praksi u oblasti prava deteta;
  - (9) unapređuje i pomaže razvoj drugih udruženja koja se bave pravima deteta;



## 1. Osnivanje CPD

CPD je nastao kao ideja pojedinaca, predstavnika nevladinih organizacija *Save the Children UK*, *Beogradskog centra za ljudska prava* i *Odbora za zaštitu dece Prijatelja dece Srbije*. Predstavnici ovih organizacija - Kevin Byrne, Nevena Vučković Šahović i Mirjana Pešić - uz pomoć nezavisnog asistenta Jasmine Grdanički, šest meseci su radili na pripremi osnivanja CPD. Za tih šest meseci, napravljen je plan razvoja i organizacije rada, programske aktivnosti, obezbeđivanja sredstava za rad kao i predlog osnivačkih akata, uključujući Statut organizacije.

Osnivačka skupština održana je u Beogradu, 23. februara 1997. godine uz prisustvo članova osnivača:

Statut je jednoglasno usvojen i predstavlja najviši pravni akt ove organizacije. Do sada je izmenjen dva puta.

CPD je u pripremnoj fazi i tokom prvih nekoliko meseci rada, koristio gostoprivrstvo organizacije *Save the Children UK* u Beogradu (Generala Hanrlisa 1). Od juna 1997. do septembra 1998. godine radili smo u Beogradu u Mačvanskoj ulici broj 8, a od septembra 1998. godine smo u Zmaj Jovinu 25 u Beogradu.



U timu koji je preuzeo ogromnu odgovornost početnih koraka u radu CPD bile su Branka Ristić, Vesna Dejanović, Gordana Radulović, Tamara Lukšić-Orlandić i Nevena Vučković Šahović. Godine 1998. pridružila nam se Ivana Stevanović, a ostali iz današnjeg sastava su sukcesivno dolazili kako su se razvijali programi. Početkom 2001. godine, iz CPD je otišla Tamara Lukšić Orlandić, ali je i dalje ostala saradnik, član Upravnog odbora i član Skupštine.



## 2. Organizacija rada

U CPD radi, s punim radnim vremenom ili po ugovoru 11 osoba, koji programe ostvaruju u saradnji sa brojnim saradnicima - u svojstvu konsultanata, istraživača, predavača i voditelja, koji se posebno angažuju za projekte.

### Statut

Statut CPD je akt koji sadrži osnovne ciljeve rada naše organizacije, odredbe o organizaciji rada i upravljanju, kao i druge bitne elemente. Statut je javan i kopija se može dobiti u našoj kancelariji.

### Skupština

Skupština CPD je najširi organ te organizacije i njeni članovi biraju izvršno telo, koje se zove Upravni odbor, i donose osnovne odluke.

Ideja osnivača CPD je bila da ta organizacija, bar u početku, ne pretenduje na masovno članstvo u Skupštini, na osnivanje ogranačaka i, uopšte, na širenje i prerastanje u glomaznu mašineriju. Zbog toga Skupština sada ima samo 45 članova. Ovakav stav zasnivao se na uverenju da bi razvoj velike i razgranate mreže negativno uticao na slične inicijative građana u ovoj oblasti. Zbog toga smo od samog početka postavili za cilj ohrabrvanje i pomoć sličnim idejama, bilo da se radi o osnivanju organizacija koje se bave samo pravima deteta ili onima koje se, u delu svojih aktivnosti, bave pravima deteta.

Skupština se sastaje jednom godišnje, a po potrebi i češće, i usvaja izveštaj za proteklu i plan za narednu godinu, a zatim raspravlja o pitanjima od strateškog značaja za oblast prava deteta i naše osnovne aktivnosti.

### Upravni odbor

Kao i sama prava deteta, tako su i programske aktivnosti isprepletane i nedeljive. Posebni projekti često prevazilaze okvire jednog sektora. Zbog toga je saradnja celog tima vrlo bitna. Rad CPD se odvija u odličnoj atmosferi i, pored stručnosti, od zaposlenih i saradnika se očekuje ispunjenje još samo jednog uslova a to je: veliki entuzijazam. Zbog takvih članova osnovnog tima i saradnika, kao i zahvaljujući timskom radu i pozitivnoj energiji, sada možemo da kažemo da smo ponosni na petogodišnji rad i efekte tog rada.



### 3. Prava deteta - principi kao osnov za ciljeve i aktivnosti

#### Konvencija o pravima deteta

Prava deteta su danas više od moralne kategorije, jer su priznata u međunarodnom i, većim delom, u nacionalnim pravima. Na međunarodnom planu, priznata su brojnim međunarodnim dokumentima od kojih je svakako najznačajnija Konvencija o pravima deteta iz 1989. godine. U državama, prava deteta su zaštićena zakonima i drugim pravnim aktima a ostvaruju se u porodici, školi, državnim ustanovama, na radnim mestima, na ulici i drugim mestima i okolnostima. Prava deteta nam, baš kao i ljudska prava, niko "ne daje" - mi ih imamo samim tim što postojimo. Međutim, vrlo je važno da su prava deteta posebno i izričito priznata u zakonima i drugim pravnim aktima kao i da postoji adekvatna zaštita u slučaju da neko krši ta prava.

Katalog prava deteta je, baš kao i kod ljudskih prava, obiman. Kada se opredeljujemo kojim pravima deteta ćemo se najviše baviti, polazimo od pretpostavke da postoje prava koja su "iznad" ostalih i smatraju se principima bez kojih ni jedno drugo pravo ne može da se ostvari. Zbog toga u svim našim projektima uvek imamo u vidu:

- **Pravo deteta na život, opstanak i razvoj**
- **Zabranu diskriminacije**
- **Pravo deteta na participaciju**
- **Pravo deteta na uvažavanje njegovog/njenog najboljeg interesa**

U našem radu, pored toga što uvek polazimo od navedenih principa, imamo stalno u vidu i:

### Nedeljivost prava

Naime, nikada nismo smatrali da je dovoljno da se, na primer, bavimo pravom deteta na zdravlje, a da zanemarimo činjenicu da se to pravo prepliće i sa pravom deteta izbeglice na zdravlje ili pravom deteta smeštenog u vaspitnu ustanovu na zdravlje. Dobar primer je i često pitanje koje nam postavljaju: da li se bavite romskom decom? Naš odgovor je: DA, jer su Romi u školama, ustanovama za decu bez roditeljskog staranja, u bolnicama i u svojim porodicama, a mi radimo programe u svim tim sredinama i uvek imamo u vidu SVU decu.



## 4. Naš rad

### U srži svih aktivnosti CPD su:

#### Nediskriminacija

Kada je naš rad u pitanju, nediskriminacija se manifestuje kroz naše opredeljenje da sarađujemo, bez razlike, sa svima koji su spremni da rade na unapređivanju, zaštiti i formulisanju prava deteta.

#### Razmena mišljenja

Naš rad sa saradnicima, decom, medijima, administrativnim organima i, uopšte, svima sa kojima možemo i dolazimo u kontakt, uvek se odvija uz uvažavanje tuđeg mišljenja i nenasilno rešavanje sukoba.

#### Otvorenost

Rad CPD je javan a takođe i sva dokumentacija koja se tiče našeg statusa i rada.

#### Nepristrasnost

S obzirom na naš status i opredeljenost, od samog početka smo se trudili da budemo nepristrasni u našem radu i da nam najviši kriterijumi uvek budu odnos prema detetu i njegovim/njegovim pravima. Zbog toga smo se uvek trudili da svoja lična uverenja ne postavljamo ispred interesa dece. Ako smo ikada i bili pristrasni, to je moglo da bude samo u generalnom odnosu deca - odrasli.

### **Efikasnost**

Organizacija koja se bavi ljudskim pravima, dakle i pravima deteta, treba uvek da bude spremna da hitno i efikasno reaguje, bilo da je u pitanju humanitarna kriza, pojava ili otkrivanje novog problema ili pak nečiji akt kojim se krše prava deteta. CPD je mala organizacija, što znači da nam kapaciteti nisu uvek dozvoljavali da se bavimo svim problemima koje se tiču prava deteta ali smo za pet godina ipak uspeli brzo i efikasno da reagujemo u mnogim situacijama kršenja prava deteta ili njihovog nedovoljnog ostvarivanja.

### **Spremnost na saradnju**

Da bismo uspešno radili svoj posao, postavili smo od početka sebi zadatku da uvek budemo spremni na saradnju sa decom, pojedincima, drugim organizacijama, ustanovama i medijima.

## **Svojstva načina rada**

### **Informisanost**

U CPD od osnivanja formiramo bazu podataka o položaju dece u SRJ i svetu, o stanju njihovih prava i aktivnostima državnih i nevladinih organizacija u pogledu prava deteta. Bez stalnog praćenja i prikupljanja podataka, ne bismo bili u mogućnosti da procenjujemo stanje, potrebe i formulisemo programe. Ovakav sistem takođe omogućava svim potencijalnim korisnicima da se o ovoj materiji dobro informišu. Tako su u CPD nastali biblioteka, internet prezentacija i brojne publikacije.

### **Stručnost**

Naš tim je sastavljen od stručnjaka različitih profila. Brojni saradnici CPD su takođe stručnjaci koji se bave različitim aspektima vezanim za ostvarivanje prava deteta. Na ovaj način obezbeđujemo zahtev za multidisciplinarnim pristupom temi prava deteta, a takođe i kvalitetan nivo rada.

### **Metod**

U zavisnosti od projektnih aktivnosti, koristimo metode kojima se na pristupačan i interesantan način približava tema prava deteta. To posebno dolazi do izražaja kada su u pitanju obrazovne aktivnosti, gde izbegavamo pasivno učešće, koristeći radioničarske metode. Takođe, neke sadržaje ostvarujemo koristeći medijske kampanje, druge kroz publikacije, neke putem istraživanja ili lobiranja.

### **Planiranje**

Radi uspešnijeg rada, uvek pravimo dugoročne i kratkoročne planove, a takođe i precizan plan pojedinačnih programskog aktivnosti. To nam omogućava uspešno ostvarivanje programa, a posebno u situacijama u kojima se događaju nepredviđene okolnosti. Tehnike planiranja aktivnosti predstavljamo i u našim priručnicima za posebne oblasti, kao što su prava deteta i zdravlje, participacija i zaštita deteta od zlostavljanja.

### **Rad sa ciljnim grupama**

Pažljivi odabir ciljne grupe je bitan element uspešnog ostvarivanja svakog projekta.

### **Ocenjivanje efekata**

Rezultate našeg rada procenjujemo i opisujemo nakon svakog obavljenog projekta. Osim toga, uveli smo i godišnju, odnosno trogodišnju evaluaciju rada CPD. Ovakan pristup nam pomaže da procenimo šta smo uradili dobro, gde smo grešili, kako se naš rad uklapa u opšti cilj i, najzad, da vidimo kako treba da planiramo.

## 5. Aktivnosti

Budući da smo mala organizacija, nismo mogli da se bavimo svim temama kojima smo želeli i koje smo smatrali bitnim. Naše opredeljenje za određene oblasti uslovljene su kapacitetom, sredstvima i procenom o posebnoj ugroženosti uživanja određenih prava. Takođe smo, u odabiru tema, motivisani potrebom za većom ulogom civilnog društva u ostvarivanju prava deteta, kao i nedostatkom posebne politike u ovoj oblasti, kako na nivou države, tako i na nivou lokalne zajednice.

Do sada smo počeli rad u nekoliko posebnih oblasti prava deteta. Aktivnosti u ovim oblastima nisu okončane. Naprotiv, neke su počele sa osnivanjem CPD, neke kasnije a neke tek sada. U nekim oblastima smo se bavili samo manjim segmentima, da bismo kasnije razradili i proširili aktivnosti. Neke, kao na primer, lobiranje za zabranu antipersonalnih mina, bile su na našem dnevnom redu kao intenzivni projekat godinu dana, da bismo se, nakon, toga, tom temom bavili u vidu praćenja i učestvovanja sa drugim organizacijama u daljem ostvarivanju.

Bitno je da napomenemo da je, posebno u nekim specifičnim oblastima, teško sistematizovati aktivnosti i podvesti ih pod odgovarajuće rubrike, pre svega zbog njihove prirode. Tako se neke aktivnosti, kao na primer lobiranje za izmenu zakona, pojavljuju u okviru svake posebne tematske oblasti kojom se bavimo, bilo da se radi o maloletničkom pravosuđu ili uopšte o kreiranju politike u oblasti prava deteta u SRJ. Isto se odnosi i na kampanje, informativne ili obrazovne aktivnosti.

### Sistemske aktivnosti:

- **Praćenje stanja prava deteta u SRJ**

Da bismo mogli da znamo u kakvom stanju su prava deteta u SRJ, potrebno je da dobro i ažurno poznajemo stanje u svakoj pojedinoj oblasti, odnosno da raspolažemo svim relevantnim statističkim i ostalim podacima. U tom cilju, već nekoliko godina radimo na razvoju indikatora, na osnovu kojih ćemo moći jednostavno da pratimo situaciju, imajući u vidu bitne karakteristike svake posebne oblasti prava deteta. Do sada smo uspeli da razvijemo indikatore za posebne oblasti ili delove oblasti, na osnovu kojih smo sprovodili istraživanja, saopštavali rezultate i počeli da radimo na predlozima za relevantnu politiku.

Naš plan je da u narednoj godini završimo posao formulisanja indikatora i sastavimo **prvi nezavisani i celokupan izveštaj o stanju prava deteta u SRJ**. Takođe nam je cilj da napravimo kompjuterski program za praćenje stanja u oblasti prava deteta.

Izveštaji o stanju prava deteta u SRJ bi trebalo da se ažuriraju godišnje, s ciljem da se koriste kao osnov za aktivnosti u oblasti prava deteta. Međutim, prvi celokupni izveštaj služiće i kao alternativni izveštaj Vladinom izveštaju i biće dostavljen Komitetu za prava deteta u Ženevi.

Uz analizu opšteg društvenog i ekonomskog konteksta, ovaj se izveštaj posebno osvrće na problem dece izbeglica, kao i na stanje u oblasti obrazovanja, zdravlja i socijalne zaštite

- **Istraživanja**

CPD pridaje veliki značaj istraživanjima i trudi se da ni jedan projekat ne započne bez ove bitne faze. Bilo koje istraživanje u oblasti prava deteta biće još kvalitetnije kada budemo imali potpuno razvijene i obrađene jedinstvene indikatore.

Do sada su sprovedena (ili počinju) istraživanja u svim tematskim oblastima kojima se bavimo. Konkretne korake za ostvarivanje projekata u određenoj oblasti


planiramo na osnovu kvalitetnih i iscrpnih rezultata istraživanja. Posebnu teškoću u istraživanjima predstavlja nerado finansiranje od strane naših partnera. A bez dobrog istraživanja, naši projekti na "terenu" ne mogu da budu podjednako kvalitetni. Dešavalo nam se da, upravo zbog nedostatka istraživanja i rezultata, prekinemo ostvarivanje projekta i nastavimo ga nakon obavljenog istraživanja.

***Maloletni delinkventi u Srbiji*** - Ivana Stevanović, Milan Škulić; Beograd, 1999.




Studija posvećena analizi osnovnih zakona koji regulišu položaj maloletnih izvršilaca krivičnih dela u jugoslovenskom zakonodavstvu, te njihovoj usklađenosti s relevantnim međunarodnim normama i standardima. Uz analizu relevantne sudske prakse, zvaničnih statističkih podataka u oblasti maloletničke delinkvencije u SRJ, kao i rezultata vlastitog neposrednog istraživačkog rada, autori nude i predloge novih rešenja u primeni pojedinih pravnih normi.

Osim analize stavova adolescenata, roditelja i nastavnika prema pravu deteta na participaciju, ova eksplorativna studija se bavi i procenom realnog učešća deteta u donošenju odluka i preduzimanju aktivnosti u porodici i školi. Analizi rezultata istraživanja prethodi teorijski uvod koji daje sažeti pregled razvoja koncepta detinjstva, predstave o detetu u našoj kulturi, kao i pravnog statusa deteta.

**Agenda za budućnost i prateći dokumentarni film**, Beograd, 2001.

Publikacija je rezultat projekta "Deca danas za decu sutra" i osim ocene stanja prava deteta, predstavlja poruke dece upućene odraslima kao odgovornima za stvaranje politike u oblasti prava deteta, sa jedinstvenim savetom da stvaraju svet SA decom, a ne samo ZA decu.



**Nevidljivo dete - Slika deteta u medijima** - Nada Korać, Jelena Vranješević; Beograd, 2001.



Publikacija je rezultat istraživanja slike deteta koja se plasira u medijskim sadržajima namenjenim odrasloj publici. Studija je imala za cilj da utvrdi koliko su deca prisutna u našim medijima i kakva su ona u tom kontekstu. Publikacija daje i iscrpan pregled metodologije i rezultata istraživanja.

• **Kreiranje politike**

Pre nepune dve godine počeli smo da se bavimo ukupnom politikom u oblasti prava deteta. Ovaj posao smatramo krunom i suštinskom oblašću našeg rada. Ograničeni kapacitet CPD i položaj kao nevladine organizacije sprečava nas u još aktivnijem radu u ovoj oblasti. I pored ograničenja sa kojima se stalno suočavamo, ne odustajemo od namere da sastavimo model plana kvalitetne politike u oblasti prava deteta i ponudimo ga relevantnim državnim organima i političkim strankama.

Smatramo da svaka država, uključujući i SRJ, treba da ima ozbiljan i dugoročan plan posebne politike u oblasti prava deteta. Zbog toga ovaj projekat smatramo jednim od sistemskih projekta CPD.

• **Reformske oblasti: obrazovanje i sistem socijalne zaštite**

Pet godina rada 'iza kulisa' dobole su pravi smisao mogućnošću da svojim znanjima i sasvim specifičnim iskustvima doprinesemo i započetim procesima reformi.

Sada smo u prilici da kao aktivni članovi ekspertskega tima za demokratizaciju sistema obrazovanja učestvujemo istovremeno u uobličavanju opših principa i pravaca reforme i, u procesu zakonodavnih reformi. Takođe, vrlo značajan doprinos beležimo i u uvođenju predmeta 'Građansko vaspitanje' koji je na fakultativnoj osnovi ponuđen učenicima prvog razreda srednjih škola u Srbiji 2001. godine.

CPD je učestvovao u kreiranju sadržaja, izradi Priručnika za nastavnike za predmet "Građansko vaspitanje" za 1. razred srednje škole, kao i u obuci trenera.



I pored nekih programa koje smo u prethodnom periodu realizovali sa stručnjacima socijalne zaštite, uticaj CPD na značajnije promene u ovoj oblasti bio je minimalan. Posebno je bio nedostupan deo socijalne zaštite koji se odnosio na institucionalno zbrinjavanje dece. Nakon promena u zemlji, upravo o ovom delu socijalne zaštite javnost je prvi put imala priliku da nešto sazna i da uvidi težak položaj dece. Dajući nam mogućnost da uđemo u ove institucije, nadležni organi su nam pružili priliku da se aktivnije uključimo u tokove reforme socijalne zaštite. Na ovaj način smo postali i ravnopravni partneri u mnogim projektima reforme socijalne zaštite, te možemo kroz njihovu realizaciju da doprinesemo da se sistem prilagodi stvarnim potrebama dece.

Izveštaj nudi sveobuhvatnu analizu stanja, kao i pregled prioritetnih potreba svake pojedinačne ustanove. Kao propratni materijal, napravljen je dokumentarni film s najupečatljivijim ilustracijama aktuelnog stanja.

• **Uticaj na zakonske promene**

Suštinska promena u odnosu na uživanje prava deteta moguća je jedino uz postojanje čvrstog zakonskog okvira. Postojeći zakoni i drugi pravni akti u nedovoljnoj meri obezbeđuju osnov za ostvarivanje prava deteta. Zbog toga CPD prati i analizira stanje u oblasti zakonodavstva i stalno predlaže uvođenje i izmenu odgovarajućih propisa. U ovoj aktivnosti se rukovodimo postojećim standardima međunarodnog prava i najboljim rešenjima u nacionalnim pravima pojedinih država.

- **Lobiranje**

I kada postoje dobra zakonska rešenja, ostaje otvoreno pitanje primene prava. Odgovarajuća primena prava zavisi od načina na koji se uopšte sprovode zakoni u našoj državi ali i od stavova onih koji primenjuju pravo. Zbog toga je važna aktivnost CPD kontrola nad ostvarivanjem prava deteta. Pored toga, stalno pratimo i pokušavamo da utičemo na promenu odnosa prema deci.

Lobiranje ovde navodimo kao posebnu aktivnost ali ono nije samo sebi cilj i zato je sastavni deo svih drugih aktivnosti kojima se CPD bavi. U ovoj aktivnosti posebna ciljna grupa su politički odlučioci, službenici u organima uprave, sudije, zdravstveni radnici, vaspitači u ustanovama socijalnog staranja i nastavnici. U lobiranju posebnu pomoć mogu da nam pruže sredstva javnog informisanja i druge nevladine organizacije.

- **Kampanje**

Osim neposrednog rada usmerenog na donosioce političkih odluka, profesionalce u raznim oblastima i samu decu, procenjujemo da je potrebno obraćati se i široj javnosti kroz razne forme medijskog oglašavanja. Sva naša istupanja imaju zajednički imenitelj: delovati u interesu deteta nije pitanje samo dobre volje i morala već obaveze i odgovornosti.

U zavisnosti od konkretnе teme ili problema, nekada su to samo saopštenja za javnost, intervju za štampu, prilozi i gostovanja na TV i radiju kao sastavni deo opšte društvene reakcije na određenu situaciju. Isto tako, aktivno učestvujemo u zajedničkim kampanjama nevladinih organizacija obeležavajući npr. godišnjicu usvajanja nekog od međunarodnih dokumenata iz oblasti ljudskih prava ili animirajući glasače u predizbornoj kampanji - ponovo iz ugla prava deteta. Pored toga i sasvim ciljano, obeležavajući Svetski dan za prevenciju zlostavljanja, realizovali smo koordinisanu i široko rasprostranjenu kampanju koja je zabeležila niz konkretnih efekata.

Namera nam je da i dalje senzibilišemo javnost svesni da je ponekad teško direktno i neposredno meriti efekte ovakvog delovanja, ali isto tako uvereni da sveukupnost metoda koje primenjujemo teže ka istom cilju.



Kampanja obeležavanja 19. novembra, Svetskog dana za prevenciju zlostavljanja dece realizovana je kao sinhronizovana aktivnost u 7 gradova u Srbiji 2001. godine. Osim 40 TV i 15 radio priloga, kao i 25 članaka u štampi, kampanju je obeležilo 6 pres konferencija, 14 okruglih stolova, 6 radionica sa decom, 6 literarnih i likovnih konkursa i 5 javnih događaja. Za potrebe kampanje snimljena su i dva promotivna TV spota.

#### • Umrežavanje

CPD je član nekoliko međunarodnih organizacija. To su Balkanska mreža za ljudska prava (Balkan Human Rights Network - [www.balkan-rights.net](http://www.balkan-rights.net)), CRIN (Child Rights Information Network - [www.crin.org](http://www.crin.org)) kao i organizacija Defence for Children International ([www.defence-for-children.org](http://www.defence-for-children.org)). Razumevajući suštinski smisao umrežavanja, razmene znanja i iskustava i snage zajedničkog delovanja, smatramo izuzetno značajnim doprinos formiranju posebne regionalne mreže organizacija koje se bave pravima deteta. Tako je inicijativa CPD za stvaranjem ovakve mreže, uz podršku partnera dovela do osnivanja potpuno nove i nezavisne regionalne organizacije - Mreža akcija za prava deteta u jugoistočnoj Evropi (SEECRAN - South-East European Child Rights Action Network - [www.seecran.org](http://www.seecran.org)) koja danas okuplja 9 zemalja, a sedište joj je u Sloveniji. Važnim smatramo i doprinos formiranju Mreže evropskih pravnika ([childjustice@bahnhof.se](mailto:childjustice@bahnhof.se)), učešće u aktivnostima Regionalne mreže NVO iz centralne i istočne Evrope i baltičkih zemalja za monitoring prava deteta (Regional

Network of NGOs from Central and Eastern Europe and Baltic Countries on Monitoring Children's Rights; [rosc@mb.roknet.ro](mailto:rosc@mb.roknet.ro)), kao i članstvo u *Evropskoj mreži za decu* (EURONET - <http://europeanchilrensnetwork.gla.ac.uk/>). Rad na daljem povezivanju ovde neće stati, jer planiramo da još više doprinesemo umrežavanju na nacionalnom nivou.

- *Predstavnici CPD aktivno su učestvovali na 6 skupova koji su imali za cilj NVO umrežavanje u zemlji.*
- *CPD je imao i svoje aktivne predstavnike na 7 sastanaka koji su imali za cilj regionalno umrežavanje.*
- *CPD je bio organizator Drugog sastanka evropskih pravnika koji se bave pravima deteta (Budimpešta, 1999).*



#### • **Razvoj civilnog društva i saradnja**

Od samog početka rada CPD, sprovodimo aktivnost razvijanja sličnih organizacija civilnog društva. Do sada smo pomogli rad i osnivanje nekoliko nevladinih organizacija koje se bave pravima deteta, a takođe tesno sarađujemo i sa drugim organizacijama koje delom svojih programa obuhvataju i decu.

Ovu aktivnost smatramo značajnom zbog potrebe da se na nivou civilnog društva razviju mogućnosti za pomoć u ostvarivanju prava deteta, posebno na nivou lokalne zajednice, ali i zbog potrebe da se civilno društvo intenzivnije uključi u proces stvaranja, zaštite i unapređenja prava deteta i nadzora nad aktivnostima relevantnih državnih institucija u ovoj oblasti.

### **• Razvoj dečje participacije - grupa Deca - deci**

Pravo deteta na participaciju, kao kontroverza i izazov, ujedno predstavlja i jednu od osnovnih odlika našeg delovanja. Tragajući za najboljim modelom prvo smo istraživali ovu oblast i došli do saznanja o tome kako adolescenti koji rastu u našoj kulturi shvataju ovaj pojam, koliko značaja pridaju ovom pravu i koliko je ono ostvareno u svakodnevnom životu. Paralelno s tim pružali smo, a i dalje to činimo, podršku autonomnim i samoorganizovanim dečijim i omladinskim inicijativama. Tako je nastala, opstala i dalje se razvija grupa Deca-deci ([www.geocities.com/decadeci](http://www.geocities.com/decadeci)) koja već petu godinu deluje u okviru CPD i predstavlja dobar model kako partnerstvo dece, mlađih i odraslih treba da bude u funkciji ostvarenja prava deteta. Oni su danas vršnjački edukatori iz oblasti prava deteta, kreatori sajta o pravima deteta, pokretači i realizatori različitih akcija, nosioci Dečjeg informativno - kulturnog servisa (*DX, Takovska 8, Beograd, Tel: 011 / 324 20 13; E-mail: decadeci@eunet.yu*), aktivni saradnici u drugim projektima CPD.

Pravo na učešće bilo je tema našeg interesovanja i u oblasti obrazovanja i institucionalne zaštite dece pa su tako realizovana dva posebna projekta s ciljem

podsticanja dečjih inicijativa i saradnje s odraslima u školi i domovima za decu bez roditeljskog staranja.

Kao rezultat kontinuiranog praćenja uspešnosti i efekata realizovanih aktivnosti, dečja participacija definitivno dobija status principa u našoj programskoj orijentaciji - isto ono mesto koje ovo pravo ima i u Konvenciji o pravima deteta. Dečja participacija i dalje ostaje u fokusu s namerom da u narednom periodu veću pažnju posvetimo ulozi deteta u porodici i medijima.

- Članovi grupe "Deca-deci" organizovali su ukupno 40 seminara i tribina u 13 osnovnih i 10 srednjih škola, kao i u 6 nevladinih organizacija.

Priručnik predstavlja jednu od početnih faza u stvaranju sistemsko-metodološke osnove za rad na problemima zlostavljanja dece. Kao rezultat istraživanja, ima za cilj da se pravo deteta na zaštitu od zlostavljanja zasnuje na bliže definisanim stručnim standardima i procedurama, kao i da se stvori metodološka osnova za izgrađivanje socijalne mreže, tj. povezivanje i usklajivanje aktivnosti svih učesnika u zaštiti.

• **Obuka stažera**

Blisko vezano za projekat razvoja nevladinog sektora u oblasti prava deteta je i obučavanje stažera, koje podrazumeva višenedeljnu ili višemesecnu obuku u prostorijama CPD. Pored predstavnika nevladinih organizacija, stažeri su ponekad i učenici srednjih škola ili studenti ili pak, službenici organa uprave. Počevši od narodnih verovanja i magijskih postupaka u odrastanju deteta, preko analize predstava deteta u jeziku i igrovnim narodnim tvorevinama, autor se iscrpno bavi i socijalizacijom deteta u srpskoj patrijarhalnoj porodici. Za razliku od prvog izdanja, ovde se može naći i tekst posvećen empirijskom istraživanju savremenog shvatanja deteta u srpskoj kulturi.



Sve što je do sada napisano o aktivnostima i rezultatima tih aktivnosti, na neki način se prepiće sa posebnim temama kojima se bavimo. Da bi se izbegla ponavljanja, ovde samo nabrajamo posebne aktivnosti uz kratak opis a za referentne seminare i izdanja, pogledajte neku od prethodnih rubrika.

- **Maloletničko pravosuđe**

Cilj ovog dugoročnog projekta je da se uspostavi sistem maloletničkog pravosuđa, u kome će dete biti tretirano uz sve poštovanje njegovih prava i koji neće biti sistem represivnog, već preventivnog karaktera. Posebna aktivnost je rad na reformi, odnosno donošenju odgovarajućih propisa u ovoj oblasti. U ostvarivanju tog cilja preduzeli smo niz koraka.

CPD posmatra sistem u kome su deca izvršioci i žrtve kao jedinstvenu celinu. Tako je nastala ideja da se kroz niz obrazovnih i informativnih aktivnosti, stručna publika upozna sa međunarodnim standardima u oblasti maloletničkog pravosuđa kao i da se, na osnovu utvrđenog stanja, stimuliše povezivanje svih učesnika u procesu tretiranja maloletnika. U dosadašnjem radu na ovoj temi, utvrdili smo kakvo je

stanje u oblasti maloletničkog pravosuđa, organizovali brojne seminare sa predstvincima pravosudnog sistema i policije, kao i predstvincima organa uprave i škola.

- **Nasilje nad decom**

Cilj ovog projekta je upoznavanje roditelja i sredine u kojoj dete boravi sa štetnim posledicama nasilja kao i konačna eliminacija nasilja nad decom. Naši projekti su usmereni na promenu stava i prakse, kako roditelja, tako svih drugih koji se o detetu staraju, a takođe i na odgovarajuće usaglašavanje zakonodavstva sa međunarodnim standardima.

Nasilje nad decom je apsolutno neprihvatljivo, kako sa stanovišta prava deteta tako i sa stanovišta morala jednog zdravog društva. Iako je nasilje nad decom kao tema sastavni deo maloletničkog pravosuđa, smatrali smo da je bitno da se izdvoji kao posebna tema u našem radu. Ovo zbog toga što smo ustanovili da je nasilje, posebno ono u porodičnoj sredini, vrlo rasprostranjeno i da predstavlja jedan od najčešćih uzroka asocijalnog ponašanja. Nasilje je izvor brojnih trauma i frustracija kod deteta a predstavlja i iskustvo kroz koje je prošao i prolazi najveći broj dece koja su u sukobu sa zakonom. Zato smatramo bitnim naš doprinos razvoju socijalne mreže i modela zaštite od zlostavljanja, a posebno priručnik o toj temi koji smo sačinili za centre za socijalni rad i druge službe u lokalnoj zajednici.

Do sada smo se uglavnom bavili porodičnim nasiljem, s tim što u perspektivi planiramo da proširimo projekt na nasilje u školi, u ustanovama socijalne zaštite i na ulici.

- **Prava deteta i zdravlje**

Cilj ovog projekta je da se utiče na širenje ideje o pravima deteta u oblasti zdravlja, da se utiče na promenu stava i ponašanja stručnjaka koji rade s decom u institucijama primarne zdravstvene zaštite i socijalnog staranja kao i da se podstakne reforma zakonodavstva u ovoj oblasti.

Do sada je CPD organizovao niz seminara za stručnjake u zdravstvenim i socijalnim ustanovama, a takođe je sastavio poseban priručnik za zdravstvene radnike i saradnike.

- **Deca u ustanovama socijalne zaštite**

Cilj ovoj projekta je smanjenje broja dece u ustanovama socijalne zaštite, kao i humanizacija uslova života u ovim ustanovama.

Ostvarivanje projekta se odvija kroz sistematsko praćenje stanja u kome se nalaze ustanove socijalne zaštite, kao i situacije u kojoj se deca nalaze. Pored toga, radimo i na obrazovanju vaspitača i promeni njihovih stavova. Najzad, u ovom projektu je posebno važna ciljna grupa same dece, odnosno korisnika ustanova socijalne zaštite, sa kojima se odvijaju razni vidovi radionica i stimuliše njihovo uključivanje u život van okvira institucije.

- **Prava deteta i mediji**

Cilj projekta je senzibilizacija predstavnika medija, a na taj način i javnosti uopšte, za probleme stanja i ostvarivanja prava deteta.

Imajući u vidu posebno značajnu ulogu medija u informisanju javnosti ali i u formiranju predstava o određenim temama bitnim za društvo, od samog početka smo u CPD sarađivali sa predstavnicima medija. Prekretnicu u pristupu ovoj oblasti predstavlja istraživanje koje nas je suočilo sa tragičnom ali istinitom slikom o 'nevidljivosti' deteta u medijima. Na osnovu objavljenih rezultata, pokrenućemo niz aktivnosti za ozbiljnije i sistematskije uključivanje predstavnika medija u ovu oblast.

Sastavni deo toga je i već započeta primena posebnog programa medijskog opismenjavanja za decu i mlade. Cilj ovakvog delovanja je ne samo osposobljavanje dece i mlađih za kritičko čitanje i stvaranje medijskih poruka, već i način pritiska na postojeći model koji, kako podaci pokazuju, ne uvažava dete kao aktivnog subjekta već pre kao 'manjinu, žrtvu i pasivno biće' kome 'humanii odrasli' posvećuju svoju pažnju tako što se 'za njih žrtvuju'. U narednoj fazi predviđa se i ustanavljanje šireg programa obrazovanja i podrške profesionalcima iz oblasti medija.

- **Antipersonalne mine**

Ovaj projekat je pokrenut s **ciljem** da se javnost u zemlji a posebno deca i studenti upoznaju sa problemom antipersonalnih mina, da se javnost senzibiliše za opasnosti vezane za ratove i ratnu industriju kao i da se animiraju druge organizacije civilnog društva u SRJ da se uključe u Svetsku kampanju za zabranu antipersonalnih mina.



U CPD je prevedena Otavska konvencija, organizovan je okrugli sto i pokrenuta inicijativa za ratifikaciju ovog međunarodnog ugovora. Budući da su žrtve antipersonalnih mina uglavnom civili a među njima najviše deca, i budući da smo svesni činjenice da je nekoliko miliona ovih mina postavljeno na teritoriji bivše SFRJ, smatrali smo da je potrebno da kao centar za prava deteta, prihvatimo obavezu da ovaj projekat pokrenemo. Kasnije je projekat predat Helsinškom odboru za ljudska prava u Srbiji a CPD je i dalje član nacionalne kampanje.

- **Dečji rad**

**Cilj** ovog projekta je ukidanje dečjeg rada, posebno njegovih najtežih oblika, zbog kojih deca ne mogu redovno da pohađaju školu i da se fizički, duhovno i emocionalno razvijaju.

Ostvarivanje ovog projekta se odvija kroz istraživanje problema dečjeg rada u našoj zemlji, pilot projekat u jednoj školi u Beogradu gde ima najviše dece koja se bave radom koji ometa obrazovanje i razvoj i lobiranje za izmenu postojećih zakona, odnosno usklađivanje sa međunarodnim standardima.



**Specifične aktivnosti:**

- **Humanitarne aktivnosti**

Humanitarne aktivnosti CPD usmerene su na obezbeđivanje neophodne materijalne pomoći najugroženijim grupama dece u institucijama i dečjim bolnicama. Do sada upućena pomoć uglavnom se sastojala od knjiga, didaktičkog materijala, higijenskih sredstava, odeće, kao i medicinske opreme i pomagala. Pomoć su u vidu novčanih ili materijalnih donacija dali građani, privatne i državne firme iz zemlje i međunarodne organizacije.



## 6. Kako dalje

Suviše je rano predvideti kako i kada će se stanje u oblasti prava deteta u Jugoslaviji bitno promeniti, ali ono svakako treba da se posmatra i u sklopu višestrukih integracionih procesa. Za nas je od presudnog značaja proces uključivanja u evropske tokove (Savet Evrope, Pakt za stabilnost jugoistočne Evrope, Evropska unija), mada on ne može da se posmatra nezavisno od procesa na univerzalnom nivou (Globalni pokret za decu), kao i aktivnosti međunarodnih organizacija (UN, UNICEF) i tela (Komitet za prava deteta i drugi komiteti za ljudska prava).

Uprkos činjenici da je Vlada Jugoslavije prevashodno odgovorna za ostvarivanje prava deteta, civilno društvo igra važnu ulogu u ovom procesu, naročito kada su pitanju unapređenja. Nedavne političke promene u zemlji otvorile su i novu fazu u delovanju nevladinih organizacija. Saradnja sa nadležnim državnim organima i donosiocima odluka je otvorenijsa i delotvornija, ali vreme koje je pred nama tek treba da pokaže do koje mere su nove vlasti stvarno spremne da sarađuju sa civilnim sektorom i uvaže njihov doprinos. Dalje delovanje nevladinih organizacija u mnogome će zavisiti i od međunarodne donatorske politike, ali i od razvoja nacionalne strategije u podsticanju domaćih izvora finansiranja. Konačno, ali ne i manje važno, snaga i mogućnost uticaja civilnog sektora u daljim procesima demokratizacije određena je i njihovim unutrašnjim kapacitetima, spremnošću da prepoznaju prioritete i definišu strategiju svog delovanja.

Kao organizacija koja je svojim petogodišnjim delovanjem u oblasti prava deteta jasno odredila svoju poziciju, CPD će nastojati da i dalje bude značajan akter u predstojećim procesima zajedno sa svim drugim relevantnim strukturama. Saradnja i partnerstvo sa državom u svim sistemskim i reformskim procesima svakako da je jedan od ciljeva u funkciji unapređenja stanja prava deteta. Međutim, ni jednog trenutka nećemo ugroziti svoju nezavisnost i odstupiti od primarne uloge koju delimo sa celokupnim civilnim sektorom. Zato smatramo da je vrlo značajno i dalje učestvovati u procesima ne samo nacionalnih, već i regionalnih i međunarodnih umrežavanja nevladinih organizacija. Dobro organizovani i profesionalno osnaženi treba da jačamo svoju ulogu stalnih posmatrača i onih koju su uvek u stanju da

reaguju brzo i dosledno u interesu dece. Na takav način će naše delovanje, bilo da je reč o pritisku, konkretnim samostalnim projektima ili partnerskim strategijama, uvek biti u skladu sa našom misijom, a to je - puno ostvarenje Konvencije o pravima deteta.

Ova država jeste na dobrom putu, ona napreduje i sazreva, ali još joj je potrebna pomoć u naporima da dostigne nivo razvijene demokratije. Mera kvaliteta ukupnog života u državi je, između ostalog, položaj posebno osetljivih grupa stanovništva, kao što su stari ljudi ili deca, a stepen njihove marginalizacije je u direktnoj vezi sa demokratskim tendencijama u društvu. Zbog toga smatramo da je pored potrebe za hitnom humanitarnom pomoći, neophodno pristupiti procesu stvaranja i primene jedinstvene nacionalne politike u ovoj oblasti kojom bi se nedvosmisleno definisali ne samo ciljevi već i, u širokom smislu reči, mehanizmi njihovog ostvarivanja. To, naravno, znači i jasnu raspodelu odgovornosti svih relevantnih aktera.

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

## Executive Summary



## Executive Summary

This Report is an overview of half a decade long efforts and results achieved by the CRC in the domain of child rights, since its establishment till today. We hope that, based on the facts presented in it, you will be able to assess the effects achieved through our work, just as the preparation of this Report helped us not only in that, but also in conceptualizing further strategies of the CRC's work.

**The Report** is divided into several segments, beginning with an overview of the child rights situation in Yugoslavia, in the light of the current political, economic and social contexts. The circumstances in our country in the '90s had an immense impact on the situation of children. Wars in the former Yugoslavia created severe economic and social crises. The impoverishment of the population and political dictatorship created an environment dominated by violence, intolerance, xenophobia and the marginalisation of the most vulnerable groups of the population, particularly children. Positive political changes in the autumn of 2000 delivered Yugoslavia from international isolation and enabled the beginning of changes in the economic sphere. If this development were to continue, along with the solution of the existing political problems at the south of Serbia, Kosovo and in relations between Serbia and Montenegro, we could expect a gradual "healing" of society and more favourable conditions for the realisation of human rights in general and, by that, the realisation of child rights.

**After** the introductory part, we present our views on the place and the role of the CRC as a non-governmental organisation in this domain, the problems we faced after its establishment and throughout its five-year work, the priorities we set and the results we have achieved so far.

- The CRC is a non-governmental organisation whose aim is the implementation of child rights in Yugoslavia and the region. However, our aim is also participation in the development and promotion of civil society. Since the beginning of our work, we have strived for civil society organisations to find their place in the protection and improvement of human

rights as well as for the non-governmental sector to become an important and visible element of civil society.

- The system of management and decision-making in the CRC respects the rules of democratic organising and work. The Statute and membership, and the jurisdiction of its bodies demonstrate this dedication. All activities are carried out with respect for the principles we have set as a kind of ethical code in our work.

**The activities** carried out by the CRC are diverse. They are implemented through programme sectors of *information, research and education* and *the child rights policy development sector*. The administrative sector provides support to these programmes. If we were to present our work according to the type of activities, in the past five years we have:

- monitored the situation in the domain of child rights in the FRY;
- published a preliminary report on the overall situation of child rights in the FRY, as well as a large number of reports on some specific child rights;
- carried out numerous surveys and research and published the results of five of them;
- participated in the reform of the systems of education and social care;
- influenced legal reforms and the compliance of the national with international law;
- lobbied for amendments in four national laws and the ratification of five;
- participated in the organisation of several campaigns;
- participated in the establishment of two international networks and closely co-operated with five international networks;
- assisted in the establishment of four child rights NGOs and participated as facilitators in 13 seminars organised by other NGOs;
- taken active participation in 98 gatherings in the country and abroad;
- enabled the establishment and activities of the "Child to Child" group, which held 40 panel discussions and seminars in 13 elementary and 10 secondary schools;
- organised seven training-for-trainers seminars in different areas of child rights;
- organised 40 seminars for professionals;
- trained seven interns;
- organised and held 55 seminars and panel discussions for children;
- provided humanitarian assistance to a large number of children in hospitals, institutions and collective centres;
- published: 14 issues of the Bulletin, 4 authors' books, 1 almanac, 1 biennial report on the activities of the CRC, 5 books with the relevant international documents, 7 brochures and 6 handbooks;
- given numerous interviews for the national and international media.

**The specific themes** we have been dealing with in the past five years are:

- juvenile justice,
- violence against children,
- child rights and health,
- children in institutions of social care,
- child rights and media,
- anti-personnel landmines,
- child labour.

**Finally**, we present the FUTURE PROSPECTS - our view on the role of the CRC and on defining strategies in the domain of child rights.





## General Context and Child Rights in FR Yugoslavia

### The Collapse of Society and Its Consequences on Children

The beginning of the crisis in Yugoslavia coincided with the adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (the Convention) under the auspices of the United Nations (1989). In the years to come, the deterioration of political, economic and social situations in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Yugoslavia) had an immense effect on the exercise of child rights. We believe that after more than a decade of wars, destruction and isolation, a period of economic consolidation, a stabilization of political circumstances and social recovery is to follow.

In spite of the changes that were introduced, many problems still exist in Yugoslavia. A *combination of economic and political crises* and large instability and insecurity in the larger part of South-East Europe have seriously impeded the efficient implementation of the Convention. In some countries in that region, especially in Yugoslavia, the crisis had an influence on the overall situation of children, causing it to become much worse than in the beginning of the '90s. The armed conflicts, resulting in trauma and tension, as well as mass migrations of the population, brought serious problems to our country. On the one hand, we were faced with structural disparities, changes in the family and in general, as well as the incapacity of the system of social care to respond to the new needs.

### Political Changes in Yugoslavia in 2000 and Child Rights

The dramatic events on 5<sup>th</sup> October 2000 ended a decade of dictatorship in Yugoslavia. Moreover, they signified a possible end to the destabilisation of the whole region, wars and economic decay. However, the swift changes in all spheres of the society, awaited for so long by the majority of the population, did not take place overnight.

As in every abrupt political change, improvement cannot be achieved rapidly. After several months of political dialogue, the governments were established in

Yugoslavia and Serbia. This country's heritage is more than obvious. In terms of the economy, Yugoslavia is in a difficult situation. Politically, there are still several sore points - the south of Serbia, Kosovo and relations between Serbia and Montenegro. Solutions are being sought for these problems and the economic recovery of the country depends on the pace of this process. The lack of political and economic certainty makes it almost impossible for the authorities in Yugoslavia to deal with the long-term policies in the specific fields of child rights. As a start, the activities of the Ministry of Social Affairs of the Republic of Serbia and the Ministry of Education and Sports of the Republic of Serbia are encouraging.

Today, more than 18 months after the political changes in Yugoslavia, no significant improvements in the situation of children have been made. Still, many doors were opened. What was done is *the beginning of the process of demystification*. For the first time, the public in Yugoslavia is able to find out the truth about the situation of children placed in institutions of social care. Also, they can see the state of health institutions, schools and other places where children stay during the day. The dramatic situation in education (in terms of professional standards, staff, attitudes, programmes and salaries) is the subject of open debates, while the relevant administration is working on the reforms. Children's security is an issue that is discussed openly, whether it concerns the school, home or the street.

As to the realisation of child rights, i.e. information on the situation of children, we are in the *fact-finding phase*. Information is available, but it is either scattered or collecting it requires a serious research project. The government is faced with urgent humanitarian needs on the one hand, and the need to develop a long-term strategy, on the other.

*At all events, any significant change in the situation of children will depend, among other things, on the capacity of decision-makers in Yugoslavia to think strategically and create short-term and long-term plans for the future. It will also depend on their capability to "notice" children and to place them in the focus of their attention.*

### The Situation in the Non-Governmental Sector

The CRC is a non-governmental organisation - it was founded as an "association of citizens" in accordance with the law in effect at that time. In the '90s, the non-governmental sector developed intensely in Yugoslavia. Numerous NGOs were founded, as an expression of the citizens' needs to take direct participation in the process of the development and improvement of society. A number of these organisations, especially those dealing with the promotion of the values of

democratic society and human rights, contributed significantly to the creation of conditions for democratic changes in Yugoslavia. However, due to political circumstances, their work had a limited range and they encountered serious difficulties.

At the beginning of the '90s, non-governmental organisations focusing on the improvement and development of child rights were small in number, having no significant influence on policy making in the area of child rights or their implementation. In the following years, numerous organisations were founded dealing either with child rights in general or some specific children's issues. However, until 2000, their influence on the relevant policies and practice was minor. The largest contribution to the development of child rights was given through educational, research, humanitarian and information activities of these organisations.

Since the changes in 2000, the situation of NGOs has improved. In the first place, the adoption of an up-to-date law on NGOs, in compliance with international standards, is expected. The influence on formulating law and practice in the field of child rights is incomparably larger than before. For the first time we can see the results of our activities in the field of policy making, amendments in the existing legislation, compliance with international standards. As far as practice is concerned, i.e. the implementation of child rights, the role of the non-governmental sector is small but important, to the extent in which practice can be changed rapidly.

Currently, the CRC has good professional relations with the relevant governmental bodies and co-operates with them in concrete projects. We find this very important, just as we find important the fact that our independent status is of the greatest significance, because it enables us to take part in, but also monitor the activities of the government, as well as to intervene, when necessary.

Our work is impeded by numerous problems - firstly, those of a financial nature, keeping us in a constant state of insecurity and uncertainty. Then, there are problems caused by the political situation in the country, making it impossible for us to define our activities geographically. What helps us in dealing with the latter is our independent status, as well as our determination to work on the development and the protection of child rights without discrimination, i.e. regardless of political borders (although we work primarily in Yugoslavia).

Finally, as is the case in other sectors, the lack of professionals presents a problem in the non-governmental sector. Although there are many competent co-workers on specific projects, we lack people who know the kind of work in the specific environment of the non-governmental sector.

## Economic, social and political contexts and child rights in Yugoslavia

The political and economic crises of the '90s caused a large social crisis, which still exists in a way. The consequences are manifested not only as a general collapse of the system of values, but also as xenophobia and intolerance. Many children were born and have been brought up in a culture of hatred and nationalism, which was the case throughout South-East Europe, including Yugoslavia. Children have grown up with prejudices incited by their surroundings and the media controlled by the previous government, which could permanently determine their views in life. Access to free media and other independent sources of information was limited. The assessment is plausible that for a long time after the crisis ended, generations would have the feeling of "missed" years in terms of information and knowledge. The majority of children in Yugoslavia have never travelled abroad or met their peers from other countries. Nowadays, thanks to more open media, the film industry and access to the Internet, some children can find out about life outside Yugoslavia. Unfortunately, new information available to children is geographically limited to Western Europe and the United States, while information from our Region and other parts of the world is still less accessible.

Although the situation of children in Yugoslavia is directly conditioned by political, economic and social circumstances, it is also largely conditioned by *attitudes towards children and their rights*. One of the basic characteristics of relations towards children is the excessively protective attitude, at least in verbal presentation, because the *patriarchal family structure* still prevails in Yugoslavia, with the important role of the extended family, both in terms of providing help and influence. As one goes from the north to the south of the country, patriarchal characteristics are stronger and more dominant. This family structure, dominated by the *pater familias*, directly influences attitudes towards children and their right to participation, as well as the right to privacy and the right to express one's own views. Also, attitudes towards women and, consequently, female children, are mainly discriminatory and - again - stronger, going from the north to the south of the country.

*Attitudes outside the family are similar.* This is visible in the educational system, health and social care institutions, as well as in state and legal proceedings. Traditional attitudes are also displayed by the majority of political decision-makers. Of course, one can hardly expect a different attitude towards children in an environment that does not recognize and accept human rights. It is likely that the changed political situation in Yugoslavia, including the prospects for the improvement in the economic sphere and legislative reforms, will not suffice

without the development of processes to change attitudes regarding human rights and, consequently, child rights. Political, economic and social improvements are not possible without the recognition of human rights. And maybe, even more is required for the respect of child rights, particularly concerning the political and civil rights of the child, which belong in the sphere of privacy and personal freedoms.

*The situation in the family* - so essential for the healthy development of the child - has changed drastically. Most of the families in Yugoslavia have faced increasing poverty and the inability to maintain their households. At the same time, the state could not provide help in the way it had done in the decades preceding the crisis, not only because a large number of families suddenly needed help, but also because the state itself had became impoverished, using its diminished budgets mostly on paying debts, the military and the growing numbers of the law enforcement bodies.

In short, after all that has happened, *the overall situation of children* in Yugoslavia is as follows:

- Children's *health* has deteriorated;
- Although most children received an elementary *education*, the educational system has collapsed in the last decade, which is primarily manifested in the quality of education;
- *Juvenile delinquency* has increased in the last decade and juveniles commit more serious crimes;
- *Drug and substance abuse* is on the increase;
- *Sexual abuse of children* also;
- *Child labour*, practically non-existent before the '90s, has become a reality in Yugoslavia;
- The situation of children that belong to ethnic *minority* groups, especially Roma children, has deteriorated;
- On top of all that, hundreds of thousands of children living in Yugoslavia have experienced *war* and all its consequences and almost the same number had to leave their homes and *migrate* to another place.

*De jure*, child rights are fully accepted in Yugoslavia: this state has ratified the Convention and is therefore obliged to respect and ensure the *implementation of all the rights* from this international document. Unfortunately, practice here does not comply with the law again. At this moment, we cannot pride ourselves in a high and well-balanced level of the implementation of child rights.

## 1. Back ground

The establishment of the Yugoslav Child Rights Centre (CRC) was the result of an idea of individuals, representatives of three non-governmental organisations: *Save the Children UK*, the *Belgrade Centre for Human Rights* and the Council for the Protection of Children of the *Friends of Children of Serbia*. These organisations' representatives - Kevin Byrne, Nevena Vučković Šahović and Mirjana Pešić - with the help of an independent assistant, Jasmina Grdanički - worked for six months on the preparations for the establishment of the CRC. They created a plan for the development and organisation of work of the CRC, its programme activities, fund raising and proposals for the founding documents, including the Statute of the organisation.

The Founding Assembly was held in Belgrade, on 23 February 1997. Its members were:

The Statute, as the principal legal act of the organisation, was adopted unanimously. So far, it was amended twice.

By courtesy of Save the Children UK, the CRC used the SC UK offices in Belgrade (Generala Hanriša 1) in the preparatory phase and during the first months of its work. From June 1997 until September 1998, we worked in Belgrade, Mačvanska 8, and since September 1998, our office has been in Zmaj Jovina 25 in Belgrade.



In the team that undertook the huge responsibility of the initial steps in work were Branka Ristić, Vesna Dejanović, Gordana Radulović, Tamara Lukšić-Orlandić and Nevena Vučković Šahović. In 1998, we were joined by Ivana Stevanović, while other members joined us successively, with the development of the programmes. In the beginning of 2001, Tamara Lukšić-Orlandić left the team, but she is still our associate, a member of the Governing Board and the Assembly.



## 2. Organisation of Work

The CRC employs 12 persons, working full time or on contracts. In the implementation of programmes they are aided by a number of associates as consultants, researchers, lecturers and workshop facilitators, engaged for specific projects.

### **The Statute**

The Statute of the CRC is a public act, containing the main goals of our organisation, regulations on the organisation of work and management, as well as other important elements. The Statute is a public document and a copy can be obtained in our office.

### **The Assembly**

The Assembly of the CRC is the largest body of the organisation. Its members elect the organisation's executive body, called the Governing Board, and make the principal decisions.

The initial idea of the CRC founders was to avoid mass membership, at least in the beginning, as well as the establishment of branches and, in general, expansion and growing into a massive organisation. Therefore, the Assembly now has 45 members. This attitude was based on the belief that the development of a large and complex network would influence similar civic initiatives in this domain. That is why from the very beginning, we set before us as a goal to encourage and assist similar notions, whether they include the establishment of organisations focused specifically on child rights or those whose activities partly deal with child rights.

The Assembly meets once a year or, if necessary, more often. It adopts the report on the previous year and work plans for the following, discusses the issues of strategic importance in the area of child rights, as well as our basic activities.

### **The Governing Board**

The Governing Board is the executive body of the CRC. It meets regularly, at least six times a year. Its members make decisions on the most important issues for the regular functioning of the organisation, including decisions on programme activities, as well as the adoption of short-term plans and reports. This body also prepares proposals of annual reports and plans, and submits them to the Assembly. The Governing Board has 7 members. The Governing Board elects the president of the organisation, the director and sector co-ordinators.

Just as child rights are indivisible and intertwined, so are the CRC programme activities. Projects often surpass the framework of one sector. This is why the co-operation of the whole team is so important. The CRC work is carried out in a good atmosphere and, aside from professionalism, co-workers are expected to meet only one requirement - a large enthusiasm. Thanks to such members of the staff and their associates, as well as team work and positive energy in our office, we can say that we are proud of our 5-year work and its results.



### 3. Child Rights - Principles as a basis for aims and activities

#### Convention on the Rights of the Child

Today, child rights are more than a moral category because they are recognized in international law and, to the largest extent, in national legislations. On the international level, they are recognized by documents, certainly the most important of which is the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989). In states, child rights are protected by laws and other legal acts and are exercised in the family, in school, state institutions, at work, in the street and in other places and circumstances. Just as human rights, child rights are not "given" to us by anybody - we have them by the mere fact that we exist. However, it is important that child rights are specifically and explicitly recognised by laws and other relevant acts and that there is adequate protection in cases of the violation of these rights.

The catalogue of child rights is, just like in human rights, very comprehensive. When we decide on which rights to deal with most, we begin with the assumption that some rights are "above" others and that they are considered principles without which no other right could be realised. Therefore, in all our projects we always keep in mind:

- **The right to life, survival and development**
- **Non-discrimination**
- **The child's right to participation**
- **The child's best interest**

Besides adhering to these principles in our work, we always keep in mind:

### **The inseparability of rights**

Namely, we never found it sufficient, for example, to deal with the child's right to health, disregarding the fact that this right is intertwined with the right to health of a refugee child or the right to health of a child placed in an educational institution. A good example and a question often asked is: do you work with Roma children? Our answer is: YES, because Roma children are in schools, institutions for children without parental care, in hospitals and in their families and we implement programmes in all these environments, always bearing in mind ALL children.



## 4. Our Work

**In the core of all activities of the CRC are:**

### **Non-discrimination**

In our work, non-discrimination is manifested through our dedication to co-operate, on all possible bases, with all those who are willing to work on the improvement, protection and formulation of child rights.

### **Exchange of opinions**

Our work with associates, children, media, administrative bodies and, in general, all those we are in contact with, is always carried out with the respect for the views of others and non-violent conflict resolution.

### **Transparency**

The work of the CRC is public and so is all documentation on our status and work.

### **Nonpartisanship**

Bearing in mind our status and determination, from the very beginning we have strived to be nonpartisan in our work, always maintaining the highest criteria in our relation towards the child and his/her rights. That is why we have always tried not to put our personal beliefs before the interest of the child. If ever we were biased, that could only have been in the general adults - children relations.

## Efficiency

An organisation dealing with human rights and, therefore, child rights, should always be prepared to react efficiently, whether it concerns a humanitarian crisis, a rising or detection of a new problem or somebody's act violating child rights. The CRC is a small organisation, which means that our capacities have not always allowed us to tackle all problems concerning child rights, but in those five years we have still managed to respond promptly and efficiently in many situations of child rights violations or their incomplete realisation.

## Readiness for co-operation

In order to carry out our work successfully, from the very beginning we set before us the task to always be ready for cooperation with children, individuals, other organisations, institutions and media. Again, our small capacity sometimes prevented us from obliging everyone.

# The Features of Our Way of Work

## Being informed

Since the establishment of the CRC, we have been forming a resource base on the situation of children in Yugoslavia and the world, the status of their rights and the activities of the governmental and non-governmental organisations related to child rights. Without constantly monitoring and gathering information, we would not be able to assess the situation and needs and formulate programmes. Such a system also enables all potential users to be thoroughly informed on the matter. This is how the CRC has developed its library and web site and printed numerous publications.

## Professionalism

Our team is composed of professionals of various profiles. Numerous CRC associates are also experts dealing with different aspects related to the realisation of child rights. In this way, we fulfil the requirement of a multidisciplinary approach in the issue of child rights, but also a high standard of work.

## Method

Depending on project activities, we use methods that enable a familiar and interesting way of presenting the child rights theme. This is particularly evident in educational activities, where we avoid passive participation by using workshop methods. Also, we realise some contents through media campaigns, publications and research or lobbying.

## Planning

In order to make our work more expedient, we always make long-term and short-term plans, as well as precise plans for specific programme activities. This enables the successful realisation of programmes, especially when unexpected circumstances occur. We present the planning techniques in our handbooks for specific areas, such as child rights and health, participation and protection of children from abuse.

## Target groups

A careful selection of the target group is an essential element in the successful implementation of each project.

## Evaluation of outcomes

We assess and describe the results of our work after the completion of every project. In addition, we have introduced an annual and three-year evaluation. This helps us to assess what we did well, what our mistakes were, how our work fits into the general aims and, finally, to see how to plan future activities.

## 5. Activities

Being a small organisation, we have not been able to deal with all the themes that we wanted to and that we considered important. Our choice of certain fields of child rights is conditioned by the capacities, financial resources and estimations of a particular threat to the exercise of certain rights. Also, when deciding on the themes, we are motivated by the need for a more significant role of civil society in the implementation of child rights, as well as the lack of a specific policy in this domain, both on the state and local community levels.

So far, we have commenced work in several specific areas of child rights. The activities in these areas have not yet been completed. On the contrary, some began with the establishment of the CRC, some later and some only recently. In some areas we dealt with smaller segments, only to develop and expand the activities later. Some, such as lobbying for the ban of landmines, for instance, were on our agendas as active projects for a year, while later on we continued dealing with these themes in the form of monitoring and participating in further implementation with other organisations.

It is important to say that it is difficult to systematise and classify activities, especially in some specific areas, primarily due to their nature. Thus, some activities, such as lobbying for amendments in legislation, are present in every thematic area we deal with, whether it is juvenile justice or general policy making in the domain of child rights in Yugoslavia. The same applies to campaigns, information and educational activities.

## Systemic activities:

### • Monitoring the State of Child Rights in the FRY

In order to know what is the state of child rights in Yugoslavia, we have to be thoroughly acquainted with the current situation in each specific sphere, that is, to have at our disposal all relevant statistical and other data. To that end, for several years we have been working on the development of indicators, on the basis of which we can monitor the situation in view of the essential characteristics of each specific sphere. Up to now, we have developed indicators for specific spheres or fragments of spheres, based on which we carried out research, published results and began to work on proposals for the relevant policy.

Our plan is to complete work on the development of indicators next year, and to compile **the first independent and comprehensive report on the state of children in Yugoslavia**. In addition, our aim is to design a computer application for monitoring the situation in the domain of child rights.

Reports on the state of children in the FRY should be updated annually, for use as a basis for activities in the area of child rights. However, the first comprehensive report will serve as the alternative report to the Governmental report and will be submitted to the Committee on the Rights of the Child in Geneva.


In addition to an analysis of the general social and economic context, the Report deals with the problem of refugee children in particular as well as the situation in the realms of education, health and social care.

### • Research

The CRC attaches great importance to research and we strive not to commence a single project without this essential phase. Any research in the domain of child rights will be of a much higher quality once we have developed and processed unique indicators.


So far, we have carried out (or commenced) research in all thematic areas we deal with. Concrete steps in the implementation of projects in a certain area are planned on the basis of reliable and exhaustive research results. A particular difficulty in research is the unwillingness of our partners to finance such activities. Still, without thorough research, our "field" projects cannot be of the same quality. There were occasions when, merely for the lack of research and results, we had to interrupt the implementation of a project and continue after the research was completed.

***Juvenile Delinquents in Serbia*** - Ivana Stevanović, Milan Škulić; Belgrade, 1999 (Serbian)




A study on the analysis of laws regulating the situation of juvenile offenders in the Yugoslav legislation and their compliance with the relevant international norms and standards. In addition to the analysis of the relevant court practice, official statistical data and the results of their research, the authors offer suggestions for new solutions in the implementation of specific legal norms.

***Child Participation in Focus*** - Mirjana Pešić, Biljana Branković, Smiljka Tomanović-Mihajlović, Vesna Dejanović; Belgrade, 1999 (Serbian, summary in English)



Besides the analysis of adolescents', parents' and teachers' views on the child's right to participation, this explorative study deals with the assessment of the real life participation of children in decision-making and taking the initiative in family and school. The analysis of the research results is preceded by a theoretical introduction with a brief overview of the development of the concept of childhood, the perception of the child in our culture, as well as the legal status of the child.

The publication offers an overview of the analysis of press articles on children throughout 1998 and 1999, as well as an analysis of the promotion of the Convention on the Rights of the Child in the media.



### ***Agenda for the Future and a documentary film*, Belgrade, 2001 (Serbian and English)**

The publication is the result of the project "Children of Today for Children of Tomorrow". In addition to the assessment of the situation of children, it presents children's messages to adults as those responsible for policy making in the area of child rights, with unique advice to them to create a world WITH children instead of only FOR children.



### ***The Invisible Child - The Image of the Child in the Media* - Nada Korać, Jelena Vranješević; Belgrade, 2001 (Serbian, summary in English)**



The publication is the result of the research on the image of the child presented in media contents intended for an adult audience. The study's aim was to determine the extent to which children are present in our media and what they are like in that context. The publication offers an extensive overview of the research methodology and results.

- **Policy Making**

Almost two years ago, we started activities on the overall policy in the area of child rights. We regard this task as the highlight and essential area of our work. The limited resources of the CRC and its status as a non-governmental organisation prevent us from engaging in more active work in this area. Despite the limitations we are facing, we are not abandoning our intention to create the model of a quality policy plan in the domain of child rights and offer it to the relevant governmental bodies and political parties.

We believe that every country, including Yugoslavia, should have a serious long-term plan for a specific policy in the area of child rights. That is why we regard this project as one of the systemic projects of the CRC.

- **Reform areas: education and the system of social care**

The five years of our "behind the scenes" work gained their true meaning with the opportunity to contribute our knowledge and quite specific experience to the ongoing reforms.

As active members of the expert team for the democratization of the system of education, we now have the opportunity to participate both in the formulation of general principles and the course of the reform and in legislation reforms. Another contribution of ours is in the introduction of a new subject in schools - Civil Education - which was offered as an optional course to first grade students in elementary and secondary schools in Serbia in 2001. Besides participating in the creation of the content of the course, we worked on the training of trainers for teachers.

The CRC participated in the creation of the contents and the Teacher's Handbook for the course in "Civil Education" for the 1<sup>st</sup> year of secondary schools, as well as in the training of trainers.



Although we carried out several programmes for professionals in the area of social care in the previous period, the influence of the CRC on any notable changes in this area was insignificant. Particularly inaccessible was the segment of the system referring to the institutional care of children. After the changes in the country, for the first time the public had the opportunity to learn of and gain an insight into the distressing situation of children. By enabling us to enter these institutions, the relevant authorities gave us the opportunity to engage more actively in the streams of the reform of social care. Thus, we became equal partners in many projects on the reform of the system of social care, through which we can contribute to the adjustment of the system to children's real needs.

### ***The Situation of Children in Institutions of Social Care; Belgrade, 2001 (Serbian and English)***



The publication was created by an interdisciplinary team consisting of professional associates of the CRC, the Ministry of Social Affairs and the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Serbia. The report offers a comprehensive analysis of the situation, as well as an overview of priority needs for each institution. A documentary film with the most striking illustrations of the current state accompanies the report.

- *A computer application was created for data on the situation of children in institutions of social care in Serbia.*

- **Influence on amendments to legislation**

Essential change in the exercise of child rights is possible only with the existence of a firm legislation framework. The existing laws and other legal acts do not provide sufficient grounds for the implementation of child rights. Consequently, the CRC monitors and analyses the situation in the area of legislation and proposes the introduction and amendments of relevant regulations. In this activity we are guided by the existing standards of international law and the best solutions in the national legislations of some countries.



Following the guidelines for the preparation of periodical reports for state parties to the Convention on the Rights of the Child, the publication offers a comparative overview of the current legislation in the FRY. The relevant provisions of national legislation are identified and systematised, but not analysed in terms of compliance with the Convention.

- **Lobbying**

Even when good legal solutions exist, the question of their implementation is still open. Adequate implementation depends on the way laws are enforced in our country in general, but also on the attitudes of those who implement the law. Therefore, an important activity of the CRC is to oversee the implementation of child rights. In addition, we constantly monitor and try to influence a change of attitudes towards children.

Here, lobbying is given as a specific activity. However, it is not an aim in itself and is, therefore, an integral part of other activities of the CRC. The specific target groups in this activity are decision makers, administration officers, judges, health professionals, carers in institutions of social care and teachers. Media and other NGOs are our important co-operators in lobbying.




Advice to adults on how to help children in stressful situations. The brochure is intended for parents, with instructions on how to help children to cope with troubles.

A brochure intended for parents, primarily mothers who have just given birth, encouraging them in a warm and open way to accept the concept of child rights.

A brochure published on the occasion of the 19<sup>th</sup> November, Child Abuse Prevention Day. Besides the definition of child abuse, the brochure offers recommendations about what to do when a child is a victim of abuse.

- **Campaigns**

Apart from the direct work targeting political decision-makers, professionals in various spheres and children themselves, we find it necessary to address the wider public through different forms of media advertising. All our public appearances have a common denominator: to act in the interest of the child is not just a question of good will and morals, but also an obligation and a responsibility.

Depending on the concrete theme or problem, sometimes they are only press releases, interviews for the press, TV and radio coverage, as an integral part of the social response to a certain situation. Likewise, we take active participation in joint NGO campaigns, for instance, marking the anniversary of the adoption of an international human rights document or sensitizing voters in election campaigns - again from the child rights perspective. In addition, we purposely marked Child Abuse Prevention Day and organised a coordinated and widespread campaign that had a range of concrete outcomes.

We intend to keep on sensitizing the public, although we are aware that sometimes it is difficult to measure the outcomes of such activities. We are also convinced that the comprehensiveness of the method we use is directed towards the same goal.



The campaign marking the 19<sup>th</sup> November, Child Abuse Prevention Day, was carried out as a synchronised activity in seven towns throughout Serbia, in 2001. In addition to 40 TV and 15 radio features, as well as 25 articles in the press, the campaign had 6 press conferences, 14 round tables, 6 workshops for children, 6 literary and art competitions and 5 public events. Two promotional TV clips were filmed for the campaign.

#### • **Networking**

The CRC is a member of several international organisations: the Balkan Human Rights Network - BHRN ([www.balkan-rights.net](http://www.balkan-rights.net)), Child Rights Information Network - CRIN ([www.crin.org](http://www.crin.org)) and Defence for Children International - DCI ([www.defence-for-children.org](http://www.defence-for-children.org)). By understanding the essential purpose of networking, the exchange of knowledge and experience, and the strength of joint action taking, we find particularly important the contribution to the establishment of a regional network of child rights organisations. Thus, an initiative of the CRC for the establishment of such a network led to founding a new and independent regional organisation - South-East European Child Rights Action Network - SEECRAN ([www.seecran.org](http://www.seecran.org)), which today has 9 member-countries and is seated in Slovenia. We also find very important our contribution in the establishment of the network of European lawyers working for child rights ([childjustice@bahnhof.se](mailto:childjustice@bahnhof.se)), participation in the activities of the Regional Network of NGOs from Central and Eastern Europe and Baltic Countries on Monitoring Children's Rights ([rosc@mb.roknet.ro](mailto:rosc@mb.roknet.ro)), as well as our membership in the European Children's

Network - EURONET (<http://europeanchilrensnetwork.gla.ac.uk>). Our engagement in further linking will not stop here, because we plan to contribute to networking on the national level.

- *Representatives of the CRC took active participation in 6 gatherings focused on NGO networking in the country;*
- *The CRC participated in 7 meetings whose aim was regional networking;*
- *The CRC organised the Second Meeting of European Lawyers Working for Children's Rights (Budapest, 1999).*

#### **• Development of the civil sector and co-operation**

The CRC has carried out activities focused on the development of similar non-governmental organisations since its establishment. So far, we have assisted in the establishment and activities of several child rights NGOs. We also co-operate closely with other organisations whose specific programmes include children.

We consider this activity important because of the need to develop possibilities for assistance in the implementation of child rights within civil society, particularly at local community level, but also because of the need to involve civil society more intensely in the process of the creation, protection and improvement of child rights, as well as monitoring the activities of the relevant governmental institutions in this sphere.

### ***Participation in international gatherings***

- *The staff of the CRC attended a total of 12 international seminars and training sessions in the domain of child rights, human rights, child participation and PR;*
- *Representatives of the CRC participated in 24 international conferences and professional gatherings in the broader domain of child rights, in 8 of which they had the roles of lecturers/facilitators.*

### **• Development of child participation - "Child to Child" group**

The child's right to participation, as a controversy and a challenge, is one of the basic features of our work. In search of the best model, we first did research in this sphere, discovering adolescents' comprehension of this notion in our culture, how much importance they attach to this right and to what extent it is realised in their everyday life. At the same time, we have provided support to independent and self-organised children's and youth organisations. As a result, the "Child to Child" group ([www.geocities.com/decadeci](http://www.geocities.com/decadeci)) was established. It survived and is still developing. It has been active for five years, representing a good model of how the partnership of children, youth and adults should be in the function of the implementation of child rights. Today, they are peer educators in the sphere of child rights, designers of a child rights web site, initiators and organisers of various activities, carriers of an information service for children and youth (*DX, Takovska 8, Belgrade, Telephone: +381 11 324 20 13; E-mail: decadeci@unet.yu*) and active co-workers in other CRC projects.

The right to participation has been a topic of our interest in the sphere of education and institutional care, as well. Thus, two projects focused on encouraging children's initiatives and co-operation with adults were carried out in the school and in homes for children without parental care.

As a result of the continual monitoring of the success and outcomes of the completed activities, child participation is definitely gaining the status of a principle in our programme orientation - the same place that this right has in the Convention on the Rights of the Child. Child participation still remains in our focus. We intend to pay more attention to the role of the child in the family and media.

- The members of the "Child to Child" group organised a total of 40 seminars and panel discussions in 13 elementary and 10 secondary schools.*



### Educational activities:

#### • Training of trainers

From the beginning of our work, our intention has been to enable the dissemination of knowledge in the area of child rights by educating trainers who will carry on the work. Therefore, we have prepared several programmes, depending on the area that needed trainers, and we keep organising seminars for the education of this target group.


The aim of the handbook is to make the contents of the "Child Rights and Health" seminars accessible to a broader circle of readers. It was created as a reminder to health professionals working with children. In its introduction it offers a theoretical concept of child rights, the perception of childhood as well as the child's developmental abilities and right to health. In addition, it provides an exhaustive analysis of conditions needed for the exercise of the child's right to health. With examples from the practice, it also contains research results on children's/youth and health professionals' views on the exercise of the child's right to health.

**Child Rights and Health - A Guide through Child Rights in Health Care -** Viktorija Cucić, ed.; Belgrade, 2000 (Serbian)

The handbook is intended not only for health professionals, but also for other professionals working with children, as well as parents, children and youth. By analysing children's rights to health and health care, the right to be informed, the right to form one's own views and to participate in decision-making, the right to protection of privacy and reputation, as well as the right to the protection from abuse and neglect, the handbook offers suggestions and ideas for the improvement of child rights in the domain of health care.



**Protection of Children from Abuse - Handbook for Centres for Social Work and other Services in Local Community** - Nevenka Žegarac, Ljiljana Mijanović, Mirjana Obretković, Ljubomir Pejaković, Ivana Simović; Belgrade, 2001 (Serbian)



The handbook represents one of the initial phases in the creation of a systemic-methodological basis for work concerning the problem of child abuse. As the result of a survey, its aim is to contribute to a closer definition of professional standards and procedures, as well as to create a methodological basis for building a social network, i.e. the linking and co-ordination of activities of all the actors in the process of protection.

- **Training of interns**

The education of interns is closely related to the project of NGO development in the area of child rights. It includes several week or a month of training in the CRC office. In addition to NGO representatives, the interns are sometimes high school, university or post-graduate students or administration officers. So far, most of our interns were from Yugoslavia, but several also came from abroad.

A criminological study on the sexual abuse of children, the result of the author's work in several projects in this area. The study treats the problem of incest comprehensively, starting from reviewing family incest pathology, the social context and the psychology of incest victims, legal regulations and NGO activities in this area.



**A Blow Upon Soul** - Nada Banjanin-Đuričić; Belgrade, 1998 (Serbian; summary in English)

A sociological study on child abuse in the family, presenting pioneer work in the area of social pathology. The author analyses the phenomenon of child abuse in a systematic way, dealing not only with its forms and frequency, but also prevention and treatment.

**The Image of the Child In Serbian Culture** - Žarko Trebešanin; Belgrade, 2000 (Serbian; summary in English)

The book is a mixture of anthropological and psychological knowledge. It is the result of the author's research and theoretical work in this area, describing folk customs and magic rites as the child grows up, analyzing the perception of the child in language and folklore. The author also deals with the child's socialization in the Serbian patriarchal family. The first edition was extended with a text dedicated to the empirical research of the contemporary perception of the child in Serbian culture.



**Child Rights and International Law** - Nevena Vučković Šahović; Belgrade, 2000 (Serbian; extended summary in English)



A monograph on child rights and international law, contributing to the creation of a conceptual basis for legal policy in this area. The book is the result of the author's long and active engagement in the area of human and child rights, in particular. Due to its comprehensive approach and the popular way in which it presents the whole matter of international law and practice, the book is recommended not only to law students, but also to a broader professional audience.

## Specific Themes:

The activities and their outcomes presented so far in the Report are interconnected with the specific themes we deal with. In order to avoid repetition, we shall list and briefly describe only the specific activities. Further reference to seminars and publications can be found in the preceding chapters of the Report.

- **Juvenile justice**

The aim of this long-term project is to establish the system of juvenile justice that will treat the child with full respect of his/her rights and that will not be a system of a repressive, but rather of a preventive character. A specific activity of this project is the work on amendments in legislation and the introduction of new regulations in this sphere. In fulfilling this aim we have taken a series of steps.

The CRC regards the system in which children are both offenders and victims as a unified entirety. Thus, an idea was born to acquaint the professional public, through a range of educational and awareness raising activities, with international standards in the area of juvenile justice and, based on the assessed situation, to stimulate the interlinking of all actors in the process of the treatment of a juvenile. In our work so far, we have assessed the situation in the area of juvenile justice and organised

numerous seminars with representatives of the legal system, the police, as well as administration bodies and schools.

- **Child abuse**

The aim of this project is to acquaint parents and the child's environment with the harmful consequences of abuse and to eliminate child abuse. Our projects are focused on the changing of attitudes and practices of both parents and all those who provide care to children, but also on the relevant compliance of laws with international standards.

Violence against children is absolutely unacceptable, both from the perspective of child rights and the morals of a healthy society. Although as a theme it is an integral part of juvenile justice, we found it important to distinguish it as a specific theme in our work. This is because we ascertained that violence, especially in the family, is widespread and is one of the most frequent causes of asocial behaviour. Violence is a source of numerous traumas and frustrations for the child. It was and is experienced by the majority of children in conflict with the law. Therefore, we find our contribution to the development of a social network and the model of protection from abuse very important, particularly the handbook on this issue, which we created for centres of social work and other services in local community.

Up to now, we have mainly dealt with family violence. However, we plan to expand the project to violence in school, institutions of social care and the street.

- **Child rights and health**

The aim of this project is to influence the dissemination of the notion of child rights in the sphere of health, to influence the change of attitudes and conduct of professionals working with children in institutions of primary health care and social care, as well as to incite a reform of the legislation in this sphere

So far, the CRC has organised a series of seminars for professionals in health and social care institutions and created a handbook for health workers.

- **Children in institutions of social care**

The aim of this project is to decrease the number of children in institutions of social care and the humanisation of living conditions in these institutions.

The project involves systematic monitoring of the state of children in institutions of social care, as well as the situation of children in them. In addition, we work on the education of carers and on changing their attitudes. Finally, a particularly important target group in this project are children themselves, i.e. the users in institutions of social care. We carry out various forms of workshops for them and stimulate their inclusion in life outside the institutions.

- **Child rights and the media**

The aim of the project is to sensitise media representatives and, thus, the general public, for the problems of the state and implementation of child rights.

Bearing in mind the particularly important role of the media in informing the public, but also in shaping opinions on themes relevant for society, we have co-operated with media representatives from the very beginning. The turning point in our approach in this sphere was a survey in which we were confronted with a tragic but true picture of the 'invisibility' of the child in the media. Based on the published results, we will initiate a series of activities aiming at a more serious and systematic involvement of media representatives in this sphere.

This includes the ongoing implementation of a special media literacy programme for children and youth. The aim is not only to empower children and youth for the critical reading and creation of media messages - it is also a way of putting pressure on the existing model, which, as our data shows, does not regard the child as an active subject, but rather as a 'minority, a victim and a passive being', to whom 'humane adults' provide care by 'sacrificing' themselves. In the following phase we plan to establish a comprehensive programme of education and support to media professionals.

- **Anti-personnel mines**

This project was initiated with the aim to raise the awareness of the public and, in particular, children and university students regarding the issue of AP mines, to sensitise the public about the dangers of war and the war industry and to animate other civil society organisations in Yugoslavia to join the International Campaign to Ban Landmines.

The CRC translated the Ottawa Convention, organised a round table and started the initiative for the ratification of this international treaty. In view of the fact that landmine victims are mostly civilians and children in particular and being aware of

the fact that several millions of landmines are planted on the territories of the former Yugoslavia, we found it necessary, as a child rights centre, to assume the responsibility of initiating the project. Later, the project was handed over to the Helsinki Committee for Human Rights in Serbia and the CRC is still a member of the national campaign.

- **Child labour**

The aim of this project is the elimination of child labour, particularly its worst forms, preventing children's regular schooling and their physical, spiritual and emotional development.

The project is carried out through a research on the issues of child labour in our country, a pilot project in a Belgrade school with a large number of working children whose education and development is impeded by their work, and lobbying for amendments in the existing legislation, that is, its compliance with international standards.

### **Specific Activities:**

- **Humanitarian activities**

Humanitarian activities of the CRC are focused on providing the necessary material assistance to the most vulnerable groups of children in institutions and hospitals. The aid distributed so far consisted mostly of books, didactic material, hygiene items, clothes, as well as medical equipment and devices. It was provided by citizens, private and state-owned corporations from the country and international organisations, in the form of financial and material donations.



## 6. Future Prospects

It is too early to anticipate how and when the situation in the domain of child rights in Yugoslavia will change significantly, but it should certainly be looked upon in view of multiple integration processes. For us, crucial importance lies in the process of inclusion in European trends (European Council, South-East Europe Stability Pact, European Union), although it cannot be viewed independently of universal processes (Global Movement for Children), as well as the activities of international organisations (UN, Unicef) and bodies (Committee on the Rights of the Child and other committees on human rights).

Despite the fact that the Government of Yugoslavia is primarily responsible for the implementation of child rights, civil society remains a very important actor in the process, particularly in regard to improvements. The recent political changes in the country have opened a new phase in the activities of non-governmental organisations. Co-operation with the relevant governmental bodies and decision-makers is more open and effective, but time will show to what extent the new authorities are willing to co-operate with the civil sector and to acknowledge their contribution. Further activities of non-governmental organisations will also largely depend on international donor policy, but also on the development of the national strategy for encouraging national sources of financial support. Last but not least, the strength and ability of the civil sector to influence further processes of democratisation are determined by their internal capacities and their readiness to identify priorities and define the strategies of their further action-taking.

As an organisation that has, through its five-year work, clearly defined its place, the CRC will strive to remain an important actor in the forthcoming processes, in co-operation with all other relevant structures. Co-operation and partnership with the state in all systemic and reform processes certainly is one of the aims concerning the improvement of the situation of child rights. However, under no circumstances shall we risk our independence and digress from the primary role we share with the entire civil sector. Therefore, we believe it is important to continue to participate in the processes not only of national, but also regional and international networking of

non-governmental organisations. By being well organised and professionally qualified, we should strengthen our role as constant observers and those who are always ready to react quickly and consistently in the interest of children. In such a manner our actions, whether they concern exerting pressure, concrete independent projects or partner strategies, will always be consistent with our mission, which is - the full implementation of the Convention on the Rights of the Child.

This country is now on the right track, advancing and maturing, but it still needs assistance in its endeavours to reach the level of a developed democracy. The measure of the overall quality of life in a country is, among other factors, the state of particularly vulnerable groups of the population, such as the old or children, and the degree of their marginalisation is directly linked with democratic tendencies in society. Hence, we believe that along with the need for immediate humanitarian assistance, it is necessary to undertake the process of the creation and implementation of a unified national policy in this domain, which would clearly define not only its aims, but also, in the broad sense of the word, the mechanisms for its implementation. This, certainly, means a clear division of responsibilities among all the relevant actors.
